# ♦ Federal Bureau of Prisons Pharmacy Meeting

o RADM Pittman attended the meeting and reported that it was very well organized and well attended.

#### ♦ Flu Vaccine

o Good supply expected for the 2006-2007 season.

## ♦ CPO/PAC Chair Meeting

- All COERS are due in officers' eOPFs by November 20, 2006; CPO's plan to release a document to assist officers with completing their COERS; OCCO is expected to address the issue of missing COERS; must have COERS on file for promotions, etc.
- Officers' Time how much on duty time should be spent on Corps activities? What is expected of officers for officership?
- Awards Task Force Acting Surgeon General Moritsugu appointed a panel to develop recommendations regarding the awards process. The panel will request comments from all of the PACs.
- o Transformation positions are still available in OCCO and OCCFM.
- o Permanent promotions: waiting for release, hopefully in next few weeks; orders are being cut
- Readiness requirements: for purpose of promotions, there is consideration that there should be 2 dates by which officers should meet basic readiness (i.e. Dec. and May)

There is a new JOAG Executive Committee for 2006-2007. LCDR Thomas Pryor will be the JOAG Chair. LT Aimee Treffiletti is the new Chair-Elect; LCDR Ernest is the new Vice Chair; and LT Jennifer Freed is the new Executive Secretary. The New Senior Advisor has not been released. There will be no general JOAG meeting this month. The next meeting will be in October. JOAG medallions are now available, see website.

The PharmPAC needs a liaison for the American Public Health Association. A nomination request will be sent out on the listserve.

## **Student Award**→ CDR Garvey

The workgroup proposed a revision of the eligibility criteria. The proposed change is that group awards will now be considered. After discussion, the PAC decided to send the proposal back to the workgroup for further development. All interested persons may submit comments to CDR Garvey no later than Friday, September 15. Informational letters are due to be sent to the pharmacy school deans in December.

#### **Legislative Update** $\rightarrow$ CAPT Hess

CAPT Hess and some of his pharmacy students looked at proposed legislation to find any impact on pharmacy practice. The purpose of this project is to keep the CPO and the Office of the Surgeon General informed of legislation coming down the pike. CAPT Hess circulated a spreadsheet, which contained descriptions of 35 bills. The spreadsheet will be sent out on the listserv.

## **Immunization Proposal**

- Proposal to provide APhA's Pharmacy-Based Immunization Delivery Certification Program at the COA meeting in 2007 in Cincinnati
- Identified 3 officers who are certified to instruct the course
- ♦ The group is considering a grant submission to ASHP

- ◆ CAPT Farrell (COA) will provide a room free of charge
- ♦ MOA CAPT Bina has determined that there is no need for a MOA; this will involve a change in the BOP purchase order to permit non-BOP pharmacists to participate
- ♦ Need to determine level of interest (3 trainers could effectively train 50 officers); LCDR Mouakket will send request through listserve to find out who is interested and their preference for timing (i.e. before or after the COA meeting)
- ♦ It was suggested that the PAC discuss with RADM Babb the possibility of offering this training to other disciplines (i.e. dentists); however it was pointed out that APhA is not including training in administration of the smallpox vaccine and the dentists need that component
- ◆ LCDR Karen Williams reported that there are 3 FOH clinics that are willing to host pharmacists who would like to practice their immunization skills during the upcoming flu season. She needs to know who is interested, preferred site, and dates. They will try to have 2-3 people at a given time for support in this new practice environment. A message will go over the listserv to identify immunization certified pharmacists who wish to participate.

#### **Update of Readiness Status**→ CDR Sood

Pharmacy category is currently at 69%. The Corps-wide total is 70.4%.

# **Update on Mentoring Program**→ CAPT Golson

Since the beginning of the program, twenty-seven mentees have been matched with mentors. Fifteen of these are new calls to active duty. CAPT Golson has a breakdown by agency and month. No feedback will be received until the 6 month point.

- ◆ Letters to Deans of Schools of Pharmacy letters were sent requesting schools to link the PharmPAC website to their school websites

  - COSTEP Day 10-12 students participated. Presentations were made by LCDR Chhabra, RADM Babb, CAPT Hess, and Craig Hostetler. The lecture series will continue on a monthly basis.
- ◆ Web Accessible Collaboration System (WACS) Update → LCDR Karen Williams (karen.c.williams@hrsa.hhs.gov)
  - o 138 registered university POC's (163 in database; approximately 30 have not registered on the site); e-mails are being sent to persons who have not yet registered.
  - LCDR Williams proposed an open enrollment period for the POC program; this would require the development of a policy to present to the PAC
- ◆ Associate Recruiter (AR) Program → CAPT Raelene Skerda
  - o Fillable forms now available on DCP website
  - o Required training is still in process of being put together
  - o There are links on the PharmPAC website to ARP materials
  - APhA /ASP Mid-year Regional Meetings will be held in the Fall; Need 1 volunteer to speak at each of the regional meetings (there are 8 total). Need at least 2 people to staff the booth. More information will be sent via the listserve
  - o No more funding available for FY 2006; waiting for budget for FY 2007
  - o List of associate recruiters is available on the PharmPAC website
  - o Going forward, all current associate recruiters will have to meet requirements to remain current. This includes a requirement to complete training by March 2007.

The group can create pharmacy forms which should be vetted through OPHEP and OFRD. There may be additional forms that we need for pharmacists. There will be drafts for the next meeting.
