# CPO Report: RADM Richard Walling (cporx@osophs.dhhs.gov)

- The accession bonus has been successfully reinstated through 31 December 2005.
- ♦ RADM Walling commended the PAC on the paper submitted to formulate another awards system to recognize commissioned officers activities performed outside their duty station. The paper was taken to the CPO board and the board recommended formulating a workgroup to further investigate a procedure. A recognition taskforce has been chosen and will be chaired by LCDR Scardina.
- ♦ There are currently two positions available through the Office of Global Health Affairs for a duty in Iraq. The tour will be approximately 6 months and those interested can contact RADM Walling.

- The revisions to the PharmPAC's standard operating procedures (SOP's) are still being reviewed.
- History: There will be several upcoming anniversaries that will be commemorated during the COA Meeting.
  - 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Pharmacists in Commissioned Corps
  - 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Indian Health Service
  - Retirement of RADM Walling
- <u>Recruitment</u>→ CDR James Bresette (<u>james.bresette@ihs.gov</u>)
  - OCFM and IHS is developing a proposal for an early commissioning program. It would allow students after their first professional year to enter into the inactive reserves of PHS. The advantage to this is there is no requirement to come into the Corps and when graduated, the officer will gain time for years of service and can enter at a higher year of service on the pay scale.
  - A survey is being sent out to a select number of Points of Contact to test the website on reporting POC activity.
  - The APha-ASP midyear meetings are currently being held. LCDR Christine Bina reported that the panel discussions have been successful in the meetings.

- ◆ <u>Career Development</u> → CDR Mike Long (<u>mzlong@bop.gov</u>)
  - Readiness: LCDR Mark Strong stated the category is at 41.8% qualified. Comments
    to change the OFRD requirement of dispensing hours to pharmacy hours are due by
    COB 18 Nov 2004 to LCDR Scardina and CAPT Skerda.
  - CDR Paul Huntzinger will be updating the externship site list on the PAC website. If your site is not listed, please contact him to get it updated.
  - LCDR Keats and CDR Rector were guest speakers discussing career development.
     They are available to assist the categories in various career development topics such as COER's, OPF, benchmarks, standards of conduct, recruiter training, and career counseling.
  - <u>COA Category Day:</u> CDR Chris Bina and CDR Murray Potter are the leads for this workgroup. Current plans for the event include presentations on the Medicare Act by CMS, a topic from CAPT (ret.) Jim Minor, and a PHS history presentation during the luncheon. A social event between the Temple and Philadelphia College of Pharmacy (PCP) Schools is being organized. PCP has agreed to participate in the event.
  - The assimilation package is due 11 Feb 2005. Officers can apply after 2 years of duty and are considered for assimilation into the regular corps after 3 years.
    - <u>Civilian Service:</u> Dr. Rennan Bonnel presented the results of the civilian pharmacist survey.
      - Survey went out to 187 pharmacists in 14 different states representing 3 HHS agencies (FDA, NIH, and IHS) with a response rate of 63%.
      - 40% of responders would like to participate in PharmPAC activities with the majority interested in the career development section.
      - Issues of concern to civilian pharmacists are:
        - Pay parity with private sector and lack of special pay compared to Commissioned Corps.
        - Antiquated GS system for job classification that hampers both recruitment and career progression for civilian pharmacist.
        - Career development and administration in terms of developing career ladder based on individual merit and objective job evaluation and promotion process.
        - Resources for educational opportunities and professional growth.
      - Proposed action items:
        - Tackle issues of salary, promotion, and educational opportunities.
        - Recruit civilian pharmacist representatives in all 4 PharmPAC sections
        - Have civilian pharmacist representation in national meetings along with the Commissioned Corps pharmacists.
        - Examine Title 42 and seek to streamline GS scale for pharmacists across HHS agencies.
        - Seek an independent consultant group to look into future needs of civilian pharmacists.

  - CDR Mike Long will be transitioning the communications section to the new leads.
  - The new CV is on the website. As a reminder, to be considered for promotion all
    officers must meet basic readiness standards.

- There will be a final recommendation on the new PAC website.

   Public Health Workgroup). Those interested should contact the section leads.
