CDR Sood called the December 2006 Pharmacist Professional Advisory Committee (PharmPAC) meeting to order.

# Transformation Update: RADM Robert Knouss & RADM Robert Williams

RADM Knouss described the history of the transformation process. Transformation was first announced in July 2003 by Secretary Thompson. At that time a study was launched with the Lewin Group. As part of that study, several focus groups were put together. The study was completed in the summer of 2004. The results helped to frame issues that the Corps needed to explore further. Agency heads voted on various options. Subsequently, Secretary Leavitt had discussions with Agency heads and developed his own options. It was decided that the basic Corps size should be 6600 officers with the plan to eventually aim for higher numbers. A press conference was held on January 18, 2006 during which the transformation plan was rolled out. Workgroups were established to develop recommendations on how to implement the Secretary's decisions. Consensus was arrived at this past Fall. A major recommendation was that the Corps needs to deal with force management on a more aggressive basis. Since that time there have been articles posted in the E-Bulletin. The implementation plan has been posted on the CCMIS website. New positions have been developed in OCCO/OCCFM to help flesh out the plan. They will need help from the PACs in developing the following category-specific areas:

- 1. Career development matrix
- 2. Benchmarks and indicators
- 3. Training
- 4. Recruitment

The timeline to accomplish transformation is over the next 6 or 7 months. In the Spring of 2007 a new recruitment process will be put in place, including a new automated application system.

RADM Williams emphasized the excitement of the transformation process. In his experience, the entire Department is now talking about the Commissioned Corps, which is unprecedented. He also encouraged the involvement of the PAC in the areas described above.

#### Farewell: RADM John Babb

CDR Sood thanked RADM Babb for his leadership to the pharmacy category. RADM Babb indicated that he is looking forward to working in the Kansas City Regional Office. He thanked the PAC for its important work and for the quality materials and communications that it provides to the pharmacy category.

RADM Babb reported that he sent a message this morning to all Commissioned Corps officers reminding them of the changes in basic readiness requirements and encouraging all officers to check their readiness status in the secure area of the OFRD website. Currently the numbers are very low. Originally officers were required to complete 9 core modules plus 3 modules from either Column A or B. Officers are now required to complete 8 core courses plus 4 FEMA modules. There are now several options to satisfy the PPD requirement. Officers are no longer required to report polio vaccination. Clinical hours have been reduced to 80 per year. The flu vaccine requirement is annual and must be obtained by December 31 each year. A message detailing the changes in the basic readiness requirements will be sent over the listserve.

On December 1, OFRD changed its web-based training contractor. Currently only the 8 basic modules are available on the website. They plan to have the modules for the Field Medical Readiness Badge (FMRB) available by the end of January.

OFRD plans to announce 12 leadership billets for the DC-based HAMR team and 12 leadership billets for the Phoenix-based HAMR team. These billets are conditional upon the HHS budget.

#### DC Area Immunization Training – Dec. $1 \rightarrow LCDR$ Olin

- ♦ 39 pharmacists took the course; 37 Commissioned Corps officers and 2 civil servants
- Course was taught by PHS pharmacists
- Training focused on adult immunization services
- Participants will receive certificates in 4-6 weeks
- Special thanks to the instructors (CDR Laura Pincock, CDR Michael Shiber, and CDR Nita Sood)
- Another training session will be offered at the2007 COA conference in Cincinatti, OH
- Encourage pharmacists to take the APhA faculty course; next offering is March 2007 in Atlanta, GA
