New Pharmacist Survey

In May 2007 a survey was sent by email to all IHS pharmacists on the IHS-ListServ. A total of 86 pharmacists responded, 83 from requested graduating years of 2002-2007.

A total of 68 pharmacists (81.9%) had contact with the Indian Health Service prior to employment as a pharmacist. Seven pharmacists (8%) were 437 scholars. Thirteen pharmacists (16%) completed CO-Step assignments. Three were from agencies other than IHS. Sixty pharmacists (72.3%) completed a student/externship rotation with IHS. Six pharmacists (7%) stated their first encounter was with the IHS residency application. The numbers add up to more than 83 since some pharmacists participated in more than one activity.
