Subject: Revised Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for Safety of Dams (SOD) Project at Captain Tom Dam, New Mexico (Action by April 30, 2009)

The Bureau of Reclamation has issued the attached Revised Draft EA to solicit public comments on the potential environmental effects of a proposed SOD project to correct deficiencies at Captain Tom Dam. The proposed project includes replacing the outlets works and stabilizing the downstream embankment of the existing dam.
