**US Highway 93 Construction**

## Project Facts

In January 2009, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) began construction to improve the last 15 miles of US 93 approaching the new Hoover Dam Bridge. This \$71.3 million project has been made possible through the cooperation of ADOT, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the National Parks Service (NPS), the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (BOR), the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD). FNF Construction of Tempe is the prime contractor for the project.

The construction phase will take two years to complete and will include:

- Two new lanes, creating a four-lane divided highway.
- Three unique wildlife crossing bridges.
- A new trailhead at milepost 4.1.
- A new overlook at milepost 13.5.
- Improvements to overlook at milepost 12.7.

While ADOT strives to inform the public about planned roadway restrictions, during any complex construction project there is a possibility that unscheduled closures or restrictions may occur. Throughout construction, access will be maintained to the Lake Mead National Recreational Area and neighboring communities that utilize US 93. Drivers are encouraged to give themselves extra travel time and to be prepared to slow down when approaching the work zone.
