

Hoover Dam Rules for Visitors

We want to ensure you have a safe and enjoyable visit to Hoover Dam. Please keep the following guidance in mind to ensure the safety of yourself and others who are visiting the site:

- Park in designated parking areas only.
- Vehicles are prohibited from stopping on top of the dam.
- Pedestrians are not allowed on the top of the dam during hours of darkness.
- Pets are not allowed anywhere on site. (Service animals are permitted.)
- No standing or sitting on the walls atop the dam, or climbing on canyon walls.
- Stay on walkways and in designated crosswalks; do NOT walk in vehicle lanes.
- Do not attempt to enter restricted areas.
- Do not throw anything from the roadway, sidewalks or guardrails atop the dam; from the parking areas or visitor observation points; or from any other structure.
- Weapons, narcotics, alcoholic beverages, and explosives (including fireworks) are prohibited.
- Non-commercial photo-taking and filming are permitted on tour routes and in public areas.
- Do not leave any bag or package unattended.
- All visitors to the Visitor Center are required to enter the facility through a security checkpoint. Cameras, purses, and small-size backpacks are permitted. All carry-in possessions will be scanned.
- Food, chewing gum, canned drinks and drinks in cups are NOT allowed on tour or in the buildings. Water bottles are permitted.
