

Attached please find proposed final regulations regarding political committee status that we plan to offer at the Commission's Open Session on May 13, 2004.

Authority: 2 U.S.C. 431, 434 and 438(a)(8). 13 Section 100.5 would be amended by revising the introductory paragraph and 14 2. paragraph (a) and adding paragraph (h) to read as follows: 15 § 100.5 Political committee (2 U.S.C. 431 (4), (5), (6)). 16 Political Committee means any group meeting the conditions set forth in 17 paragraph (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this section. 18 Except as provided in paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e)(1), and (e)(3) of this **(1)** 19 (a) section, political committee means any committee, club, association, or 20 other group of persons: 21

Section 100.116 would be added to read as follows: 1 4. Certain public communications. 2 **§ 100.116** Except as provided in 11 CFR 100.155, a payment, distribution, loan, advance, or 3 deposit of money or anything of value made by, or on behalf of, any political committee 4 or organization described in 11 CFR 100.5(a)(2) for a public communication, as defined 5 in 11 CFR 100.26, is an expenditure if the public communication: 6 Promotes, supports, attacks, or opposes any clearly identified candidate for 7 (a) Federal office; or 8 Promotes or opposes any political party. 9 (b) Section 100.133 would be amended to read as follows: 10 5. Non-partisan voter registration and get-out-the-vote activities. 11 § 100.133 Any cost incurred for activity designed to encourage individuals to register to vote 12 (a) or to vote is not an expenditure if: 13 No effort is or has been made to determine the party or candidate 14 (1) preference of individuals before encouraging them to register to vote or to 15 vote; and 16 No public communication is used that: **(2)** 17 Promotes, supports, attacks, or opposes any clearly identified 18 (i) Federal or non-Federal candidate; or 19 Promotes or opposes any political party. (ii) 20 Any corporation or labor organization that engages in the activity described in 21 (b) paragraph (a) of this section shall do so in accordance with 11 CFR 114.4(c) and (d). Allocated non-Federal amounts. 2 § 100.155 Any non-Federal funds disbursed pursuant to 11 CFR 106.1, 106.6, 106.7, or 3 300.33 are not expenditures. 4 PART 104 – REPORTS BY POLITICAL COMMITTEES (2 U.S.C. 434) 5 The authority citation for part 104 would continue to read as follows: 6 7. 2 U.S.C. 431(1), 431(8), 431(9), 432(i), 434, 438(a)(8) and (b), 7 **Authority:** 439a, and 441a. 8 Section 104.10 would be amended by revising the introductory language in 9 8. paragraph (b), the title in (b)(1), and paragraphs (b)(1)(i) and (b)(1)(ii) to read as follows: 10 § 104.10 Reporting by separate segregated funds and nonconnected committees of 11 expenses allocated among candidates and activities. 12 13 Expenses allocated among activities. A political committee that is a separate 14 (b) segregated fund or a nonconnected committee and that has established separate Federal 15 and non-Federal accounts under 11 CFR 102.5(a)(1)(i) shall allocate between those 16 accounts its administrative expenses and its costs for fundraising and voter drives 17 according to 11 CFR 106.6, and shall report those allocations according to paragraphs 18 (b)(1) through (5) of this section, as follows: 19 Reporting of allocation of administrative expenses and costs of voter 20 **(1)** drives. 21 In the first report in a calendar year disclosing a disbursement for (i) 22

17	federal election activ	ities, and certain public communications. Nonconnected committees
18	and separate segrega	ted funds shall allocate their administrative expenses, costs of voter
19	drives, costs of certa	in federal election activities, and costs of public communications that
20	promote or oppose a	political party as described in paragraph (b)(1)(i) through (iv) or
21	(b)(2)(i) through (iv)	of this section, according to the funds expended method, described
22	in paragraphs (c)(1)	and (2) as follows:

1	(1)	(i)	Under this method, expenses shall be allocated based on the ratio			
2			of Federal expenditures to total Federal and non-Federal			
3			disbursements made by the committee during the two-year Federal			
4			election cycle, subject to the minimum Federal percentage			
5			described in paragraph (c)(1)(ii) of this section. This ratio shall be			
6			estimated and reported at the beginning of each Federal election			
7			cycle, based upon the committee's Federal and non-Federal			
8			disbursements in a prior comparable Federal election cycle or upon			
9			the committee's reasonable prediction of its disbursements for the			
10			coming two years. In calculating its Federal expenditures, the			
11			committee shall include only amounts contributed to or otherwise			
12			spent on behalf of specific Federal candidates, including			
13			independent expenditures and amounts spent on public			
14			communications that promote, support, attack, or oppose clearly			
15			identified Federal candidates. Calculation of total Federal and			
16			non-Federal disbursements shall also be limited to disbursements			
17			for specific candidates, and shall not include overhead or other			
18			generic costs.			
19			(ii) <u>Minimum Federal percentage for administrative expenses</u> ,			
20			voter drives, and certain public communications. The			
21			minimum Federal percentage for any costs allocable under			
22			paragraph (c) of this section shall be 50 percent.

1	(4) The portion of the public communication that is attributed to clearly
2	identified non-Federal candidate(s), if any, may be allocated to either the
3	Federal or non-Federal account.
4	(g) Method for allocating public communications that promote, support, attack, or
5	oppose one or more clearly identified Federal or non-Federal candidates, without
6	promoting or opposing a political party. Nonconnected committees and separate
7	segregated funds shall allocate public communications described in paragraphs (b)(1)(vi)
8	and (b)(2)(vi) of this section under 11 CFR 106.1 as expenditures or disbursements on
9	behalf of the clearly identified candidates. A public communication that solely promotes
10	supports, attacks, or opposes one or more clearly identified Federal candidates is an
11	expenditure that must be allocated 100% to the federal account.
