Rulemaking Priorities

After discussion with the regulations committee, I propose the Commission adopt the following as its rulemaking priorities for 2007:

2007 Rulemaking Priorities

- 1. <u>Implement Congressional Changes</u> Implement any changes or additions to the regulations as required by Congressional action (e.g., reimbursement rules for travel on private aircraft).
- 2. <u>Hybrid Ads</u> Address allocation of expenses for advertisements that refer to a federal candidate and include a generic party reference.
- 3. <u>Ethics</u> Revise and update the Commission's ethics regulations to conform with revised government-wide ethics regulations.
- 4. Best Efforts Policy Statement Finalize the best efforts policy statement. 1
- 5. <u>FEA Interim Rules</u> Address the exemption for certain non-Federal election activities, due to expire September 1, 2007.
- 6. Millionaires Amendment Finalize interim rules at 11 CFR 400.
- 7. Address AFL-CIO v. FEC disclosure policy Finalize policy or implement regulations regarding the disclosure of materials at the close of enforcement matters.²

9. <u>Personal Use Conforming Changes</u> – Conform the personal use regulations to the revised personal use statutory provisions at 2 U.S.C. 439a.
