Mr. Katvan noted the following technical amendments:

Page 7, Line 6 of Alternative A, correct the cite to read 110.1(b)(2)(ii) and on Line 8, the cite to read 110.1(b)(5)(ii)(B);

Page 6, Line 4, of Alternative B, correct the cite to read 110.1(b)(2)(ii).

It was agreed without objection to circulate on a tally vote basis Draft B of Advisory Opinion 2004-20, as submitted in Agenda Document No. 04-62, subject to the amendment noted above, and as further amended in Agenda Document No. 04-62-A, as amended on Page 2, by the deletion of Paragraph 4, which reads:

"The practical result of changing our determination that the convention is an election would be a system that promotes meaningless filing requirements, obscures valuable information from the public view, and invites traps for the unwary to run afoul of the law."
