Award Number: 05HQAG0114**

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Project Narrative:

This project was intended to promote ongoing spatial data documentation activities in Northwest Indiana. Previous funding received from the US EPA Region 5, was used to create an online metadata compilation tool that is currently hosted by the Indiana Geological Survey. The tool ultimately produces an essential FGDC metadata record in text file format that can be saved to the user's local computer. The text file produced is in the proper format so that it may be uploaded to a metadata clearinghouse without further processing. In addition to the tool, the website offers numerous metadata related resources including the Content Standard for Digital Geospatial Metadata (CSDGM) Workbook, Version 2.0.

In the spring of 2005, the State of Indiana completed its Statewide Digital Orthophotography Program. This program created high-resolution orthophotography for counties on a statewide basis to support homeland security, emergency management, and other business and government applications. Delivery to local government took place in the spring of 2006. Funding received from the FGDC from this grant was used to

provide metadata outreach activities associated with the release of this dataset. GIS development among Northwest Indiana communities varies greatly. This new data will allow entities previously unable to afford the cost of creation or enlargement of their GIS programs to do so. It will be more important than ever for those who will use this data for basemap purposes to be able to document any new dataset that they create. It is our wish to promote documentation of new datasets by creating FGDC metadata for their spatial datasets through the use of the previously created online metadata tool. The Online Metadata Tool will provide a convenient and easy way for spatial data creators to document new datasets.

Metadata Training and Outreach Activities

The following metadata presentations were included during four full day events held in the spring of 2006 to introduce the new orthophotography to current and prospective GIS users around the state. At least an hour was allotted for each presentation and included information about preparing FGDC compliant metadata using the Online Metadata Tool. Most participants had at least a basic understanding of metadata.

- November 16, 2005
GIS Day Metadata Presentation. 10 people were in attendance for a short (half hour), Basics of Metadata presentation. Approximately 30 individuals attended during the half day of GIS activities held at Indiana University Northwest. Most attendees had very limited knowledge of anything related to GIS.

Workshop for Save the Dunes Conservation Fund and the Indiana Coastal Restoration Action Team (ICRAT)
Title: An Introduction to GIS Tools for Restoration Projects - Presentation to 6 in attendance. One-hour, metadata portion of the hands-on workshop included a brief introduction to FGDC compliant metadata. Future Metadata Activities

The Northwest Indiana Center for Data & Analysis was awarded a 2007 FGDC CAP category 1 funding to continue metadata training and outreach activities. Activities associated with this project will include:

1. Continued basic metadata outreach and training to Northwest Indiana GIS professionals. Our local GIS users group, the Northwest Indiana GIS Forum will be the focus of our efforts. Activities will include formal metadata training sessions. Outreach activities will also be provided on a statewide basis through participation with the Indiana Geographic Information Council.
2. Metadata assistance to participants providing local spatial data sets for an updated Lake Rim GIS (<http://129.79.145.5/arcims/lrim/index.html>) interactive website (working with the Indiana Geological Survey).
3. Engagement of those familiar with metadata creation through presentations and encouragement to continue metadata efforts.

Comments on Cooperative Agreements Program

This program is a tremendous effort to promote metadata creation and ultimately data sharing. CAP Category 1 Coordinator, Sharon Shin, is generous with her time and assistance. It is clear that she can be contacted for any questions or concerns regarding metadata.

The numerous metadata training resources easily available through the FGDC website are appreciated. Most training materials currently include guidance on how to search for metadata records using the National Geospatial Data Clearinghouse, “Legacy Gateway”. After much testing of the system, it is my opinion that it is not particularly helpful. I realize that this was probably part of a first generation system and the FGDC now promotes its Geospatial One Stop. Getting appropriate results from searching the GOS for local metadata records is also difficult. It appears to me that the best way to find local metadata records is to search for a particular state spatial data library. GOS appears great to search for national metadata, but not particularly helpful for local metadata searching.
