<u>PURPOSE:</u> To revise Circular 94-06 concerning the Bureau's procedure for submitting requests for apprenticeability determination. Circular 94-06 remains in effect, but one revision is shown below.

BACKGROUND: Previously, all Occupational Code Request forms were submitted to the nearest Occupational Analysis Center for issuance of a nine digit Occupational Code prior to submittal to DNIP.

<u>ACTION:</u> If the occupation is not listed in the Dictionary of Occupation Title (DOT), the <u>Occupational Code Request</u> form should be submitted to the <u>Division of National Industry Promotion</u> with your Apprenticeability Request Form. The <u>Apprenticeability Request Form</u>, the <u>Occupational Code Request Form</u> (if applicable), and the <u>Occupational Standards Form</u> should accompany requests. <u>All forms submitted to DNIP should be complete</u>. They will be returned if not properly completed. If you are aware of any National Associations/Unions that utilize the occupation submitted, <u>please include name</u>, address, and phone number with your request for possible inclusion in the mail out to industry for comment on apprenticeability.

The Occupational Information Network system (O*Net) has replaced the Dictionary of Occupational Titles system (DOT). This will necessitate a change in our AIMS system prior to moving into full use of the O*Net System, as well as addressing other areas of the O*NET System that impact apprenticeship.

The Division of National Industry Promotion is working with the O*Net Office to address moving from the nine digit code used under the DOT system to a four digit code under the O*Net System which clusters a number of like occupations.
