

NEFSC Manuscript Reviewer's Checklist

The following questions reflect the kind of advice we seek from you with regard to the enclosed paper. We do not expect you to answer all of the questions. These questions are simply a tool that may prove useful in organizing your thoughts.

1. Does the manuscript present data or findings that are not available elsewhere and that need to be published?
2. Is the manuscript aimed at the most appropriate outlet to reach potential users?
3. Does the manuscript contain sufficient data and information to document its statements?
4. Are cited literature and communications adequate and to the point?
5. Are all figures and tables essential to the text?
6. Do tables and figures adequately display data and/or relationships?
7. Are base data, analytical methods, and statistical tests adequately portrayed?
8. Are methods and interpretive concepts up-to-date and accurate? Has the author accounted for important developments in the field?
9. Are base data and statistical tests appropriate? Are the author's interpretations in line with test results?
10. Is the author's logic sound? Are statements adequately documented?
11. Has the author clearly presented ideas? Is the reader able to follow the author's reasoning? Is information contained in the tables and figures discussed or merely repeated in the text?
12. Are sections well organized?
13. Is text concise?
14. Are objectives and conclusions clearly presented?
15. Has the author accounted for principal limitations of the hypotheses, methods, and results?
