Agreement Between the Department of Defense (DOD) and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) Concerning Cartographic Support of NASA by DOD

- 1. This Agreement sets forth the procedures whereby NASA may obtain cartography support from the DOD.
- 2. The provisions of this Agreement do not apply to the Geodetic Satellite Program.
- 3. The Defense Mapping Agency (DMA) is designated as the agency within the DOD to furnish technical assistance, production, and management services in the general field of cartography when requested by NASA.
- 4. The Office of the Assistant Administrator for DOD and Interagency Affairs is designated as the office within NASA responsible for the establishment and administration of interagency relationships through which cartographic support required by NASA may be obtained from the DMA.
- 5. In advance of each fiscal year NASA will furnish to DMA through the Assistant Administrator for DOD and Interagency Affairs the NASA cartography requirements for that fiscal year and, to the extent possible, the requirements for the five ensuing fiscal years, in accordance with details agreed upon between DMA and NASA. Necessary support to meet NASA's stated requirements will be developed by DMA in cooperation with NASA personnel.
- 6. DMA will develop an annual plan to provide the required support to NASA to the extent possible, showing estimated costs, time schedules, and results to be expected.
- 7. NASA will reimburse the DMA in accordance with the Agreement between DOD and NASA Concerning Principles Governing Reimbursement of Costs, dated November 12, 1959,* or any amendment thereof, for the assistance rendered to NASA under this Agreement.
