

Dear Congressman Waxman:

This letter responds to your letter of February 7, 2002. According to the records maintained by the Office of Presidential Personnel, the only presidential appointee in the cabinet departments or agencies who was recently employed by Enron is Secretary of the Army Thomas White. Much of the remaining information you have requested is available from a variety of public sources. These include the SF-278 forms filed by Administration officials, the biographical information released publicly at the time of appointment, the biographies of senior officials that many departments and agencies make available through their websites, and databases maintained by public interest groups, think tanks, and private publishers.

The Office of Presidential Personnel does not have other records that would provide a reliable, comprehensive listing of individuals who may have worked at some point in their careers as paid or unpaid consultants, advisors, or attorneys to Enron or its subsidiaries, nor do we maintain separate records concerning the employment or business relationships of appointees' spouses.
