This Week's Hearings:

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On Monday, the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources will hold an
oversight field hearing on "Solar Energy Development On Federal Lands: The
Road To Consensus" in Palm Desert, California. The Subcommittee will explore
the complexities that surround the siting and permitting of solar plants and
transmission lines on federal lands, and examine the planning processes being
undertaken by the State of California to achieve consensus among various
stakeholders.

- On Wednesday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will receive testimony on the following bills:
 - O H.R. 1916 (Dingell): To amend the Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp Act to provide for a revised schedule of price increases for the Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp, popularly known as the "Duck Stamp", and for other purposes. "Migratory Bird Habitat Investment and Enhancement Act"
 - H.R. 2062 (DeFazio): To amend the Migratory Bird Treaty Act to provide for penalties and enforcement for intentionally taking protected avian species, and for other purposes. "Migratory Bird Treaty Act Penalty and Enforcement Act of 2009"
 - O H.R. 2188 (Kratovil): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior, through the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, to conduct a Joint Venture Program to protect, restore, enhance, and manage migratory bird populations, their habitats, and the ecosystems they rely on, through voluntary actions on public and private lands, and for other purposes. "Joint Ventures for Bird Habitat Conservation Act of 2009"

- On Thursday, the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands will receive testimony on the following bills:
 - H.R. 129 (Gallegly): To authorize the conveyance of certain National Forest System lands in the Los Padres National Forest in California.
 - H.R. 762 (Heller): To validate final patent number 27-2005-0081, and for other purposes.
 - H.R. 865 (Boucher): To convey the New River State Park campground located in the Mount Rodgers National Recreation Area in the Jefferson National Forest in Carroll County, Virginia, to the Commonwealth of Virginia, and for other purposes.
 - H.R. 1442 (Matheson): To provide for the sale of the Federal Government's reversionary interest in approximately 60 acres of land in Salt Lake City, Utah, originally conveyed to the Mount Olivet Cemetery Association under the Act of January 23, 1909.
 - H.R. 1471 (Sanford Bishop): To expand the boundary of the Jimmy Carter National Historic Site in the State of Georgia, to redesignate the unit as a National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

 H.R. 1641 (Inslee): To amend the National Trails System Act to provide for a study of the Cascadia Marine Trail. "Cascadia Marine Trail Study Act"
