Decision Notice & Finding of No Significant Impact for Middle Mountain Wildlife Savannah Project

On September 28, 2007, the Responsible Official, Marlinton-White Sulphur District Ranger, Rondi Fischer, signed a Decision Notice approving the implementation of a modified Alternative 3 of the Middle Mountain Wildlife Savannah Project Environmental Assessment (EA). Her decision authorizes the following activities to be implemented: (1) Create five savannah units totaling about 45 acres; (2) provide water sources to wildlife close to savannahs, by restoring one existing water hole and creating two new water holes; (3) commercially thin about 85 acres of stands around savannah units; (4) create about 1.1 miles of new skid trail without blading to facilitate removal of commercial timber; (5) prescribe burn approximately 423 acres; (6) treat approximately 18 acres with herbicide; and (7) maintain approximately 28 acres of savannah units using a tractor and mower.

This decision is subject to administrative appeal. Appeals must meet the content requirements of 36CFR 215.14, and may be filed by persons or non-Federal organizations or entities that provided comments or otherwise expressed interest in the proposed action by the close of the comment period. This decision will be published in the *Pocahontas Times*, which is the "Paper of Record" for this decision.
