# Do Kids Gnaw on Motorcycle Parts?

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA) was signed into law on August 14, 2008 and establishes specific limits on lead for products designed or intended primarily for children 12 and younger. The new limit took effect February 10, 2009 and lead content will be phased down over the next few years.

As a result of this law, many youth ATVs and motorcycles are currently banned from being sold because the lead content of some of the parts is in excess of the new limits.... Click here to read more.
