Dear Mr. Burgon:

This letter responds to the April 11, 2000 application for approval ("Application") filed by Flying J Inc. ("Flying J") requesting Federal Trade Commission ("Commission") approval of Flying J as a New System Provider licensee. The Application was placed on the public record for thirty days, until May 17, 2000. No comments were received during the comment period. The Commission has considered Flying J's Application and all supporting materials, as well as other available information. The Commission has determined not to approve Flying J's Application.

Under Paragraph II.B. and II.M. of the Order, Ceridian is not required to license any company against which it has obtained injunctive relief. The temporary restraining order that Ceridian obtained against Flying J, which is referenced in the materials you submitted to the Commission, qualifies as injunctive relief under the Order. Ceridian notified the Commission by letter that it would not grant a license to Flying J on the basis of the injunctive relief provision. Accordingly, the Commission has determined not to approve the Application submitted by Flying J.
