The Florida Association for Volunteer Action in the Caribbean and the Americas, Inc. (FAVACA), is a private not for profit organization formed in 1982 by Florida Governor (now former U.S. Senator) Bob Graham. FAVACA's Florida International Volunteer Corps provides a funding base for an estimated 200 volunteer missions to Latin America and the Caribbean last year. Continued concerns in Haiti – from narco-trafficking to humanitarian needs – are the reasons why the nation is by far the largest Caribbean recipient of U.S. foreign aid. The United States has a vested interest in the continued progress in economic growth, social justice, as well as the overall health of Haiti's fledgling democracy.
