
NATIVE FISH: Native fish originally came from the Upper Klamath Basin.





NON-NATIVE FISH: Non-native fish were brought into the Upper Klamath Basin from somewhere else.





Klamath redband trout are famous for their world class size.




























Suckers can live for a long time. The oldest known Lost River sucker lived for 43 years, when most fish only live for 3 to 5 years!















Blue chubs eat tiny plants and animals culled plankton. They are nature's "housekeeping" fish.







Brown bullhead are also known US catfish. They use their "whiskers" to find and taste food on the bottom of takes and rivers.






Speckled dace can tolerate warm water and they like to hang out with euch other.

















Fathead minnows are often the most abundant fish in Upper Klamath Luke.
