Update on Progress

- ★ In 2008, Jordan completed a Constraints Analysis and Sector
 Analysis that highlighted key challenges to long-term, sustainable
 economic growth in Jordan. Jordan also conducted a broad, participatory consultative process that included town hall meetings in each of the country's twelve governorates.
- ★ This process provided opportunities for a cross section of citizens, civil society organizations, and the private sector to share issues, concerns, and potential investment ideas.
- ★ These inputs identified the availability of water as a constraint to economic growth. In July, Jordan hosted a broad stakeholder workshop to identify key problems that might be addressed by an MCC investment in the water sector.
- ★ Based on the workshop results, Jordan developed a "concept paper" focused on reducing non-revenue water and increasing wastewater treatment and reuse and submitted it to MCC in November 2008. The proposed water delivery and wastewater projects focus on Zarqa, one of Jordan's poorest governorates and home to its second and fourth largest cities.
- ★ In February 2009, MCC delivered its Concept Paper Assessment to the Government of Jordan. The next step will involved the procurement of consultants to complete the relevant preparatory studies.
- ★ Under MCC's Threshold Program, Jordan completed a successful project to modernize customs in January 2009, and will complete a project to strengthen local governance mechanisms in nine municipalities in September 2009. The on-going program is managed by the United States Agency for International Development.
