



Indonesia Program Summary

Indonesia's program is helping to reduce corruption in the judiciary, providing support for the Anti-Corruption Commission, enhancing the performance of the Financial Transaction Reports and Analysis Center, and developing pilot e-procurement systems in five provinces. The program is also helping Indonesia build a robust and sustainable immunization system in difficult to reach areas.

Program Highlights

Program for Immunization.

* Approximately 3.4 million children under the age of one have been immunized with measles and DPT3 vaccines in the provinces where Indonesia's MCC threshold program is working.

94% of the roughly 10,000 health officials targeted have completed training in immunization program management, supportive supervision, and vaccine supply management,

★ Communications Forum meetings are being held regularly in 48 districts in all 7 targeted provinces, resulting in 30 decrees by local leaders to fund immunization advocacy activities beyond the term of the threshold program.

and all of the project's priority districts have launched the annual action plan created by the National Joint Expanded

- ★ The threshold program's judicial reform continued at a strong pace with 1,600 court budget and finance officers receiving training on new budget processes and 1,700 judges being trained on the new Judicial Code of Conduct. In addition, 5,000 cases were published online, meeting the program's target.
- ★ The Indonesia Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) has prosecuted 14 high-ranking officials, surpassing the program's target of 6 cases in 2008.
- ★ The Supreme Court has issued important decrees in support of wealth reporting, increased public access to information, requirements for increases in remuneration and accounting for court fees.
