

# TOP MANAGEMENT CHALLENGES FACING SOME OF THE AGENCIES IN THE I&E COMMUNITY

The I&E committee members represent seven highly diverse federal organizations. From overseeing diplomatic security in Baghdad to funding ice core drillings in Antarctica, the programs in these agencies are diverse and rely on their OIG to identify areas where management can improve its operations and efficiency.

Each year, offices of inspectors general (OIGs) identify major management challenges facing their organizations. Many of these challenges cut across bureaus and agency lines. Others represent the individual challenges facing each agency.

With a new year comes new challenges. This month we are publishing a partial listing of the challenges facing I&E Committee members' agencies as highlighted in their September 2005 Semiannual Reports to Congress. Many of these challenges mirror those reported by other IGs. We believe this will offer the IG community opportunities for addressing crosscutting issues and identifying best practices.

# WORKERS' COMPENSATION PROJECT TO SPAN PCIE/ECIE

Gordon Heddell, inspector general of the Department of Labor, is spearheading a government-wide PCIE/ECIE review of the Federal Employees' Compensation Act (FECA). Labor OIG is working with its department to facilitate the use of FECA records by other OIGs working on this issue.

The departments of Interior, Labor, Education, and Commerce, as well as the US Postal Service, Social Security Administration, and Veterans Administration have begun or are starting FECA projects. Heddell expects to issue a joint PCIE/ECIE report by the end of the calendar year. He also plans to conduct a symposium to inform OIGs about the FECA program, its challenges, and how to audit or evaluate it.
