Period covered: August 1 – October 31, 2006

Executive summary:

Recruitment continues for the Assessment and Programs and Technology Coordinator vacancies. The staffing shortage continues to affect the progress of Year 01 of the 2006-2011 RML Contract.

Karen Bülow joined the NN/LM SCR Staff as the Health Professionals Outreach Coordinator on October 2, 2006.

There will be 15 Resource Libraries in the SCR during the 2006-2011 RML Contract. The University of Texas Health Center Library at Tyler will no longer be a designated Resource Library due to an unforeseen, yet considerable staffing decrease.

The annual Resource Library Directors meeting was held in Houston, TX, on August 1, 2006 to review and discuss the 2006-2011 RML Contract.

A joint Resource Library Outreach Contacts and Library Directors meeting was held in Houston, TX, on August 2, 2006 to review and discuss the 2006-2011 RML Contract.

The Resource Library Outreach Contacts annual fall meeting was held in College Station, TX, on October 21, 2006 to share outreach ideas, review guidelines and procedures for developing outreach proposals and subcontracting, in general, with the NN/LM SCR.

Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) activities:

There were no RAC activities during this quarter.

Needs assessment and evaluation activities/data:

Ms. Bougard and Greg Bodin, former NN/LM SCR Technology Coordinator, with the assistance of Becky Lyon, NLM, have developed a follow-up questionnaire using Survey Monkey to be answered by the 33 libraries in the South Central Region that received Katrina relief from the NLM and the NN/LM SCR. The questionnaire has been answered by a majority of libraries, to date. A 100% response rate is anticipated.

Ms. Vargas facilitated a roundtable on consumer health programs at the South Central Chapter/Medical Library Association (SCC/MLA) annual meeting. Participants were encouraged to talk about successes

and challenges of consumer health outreach. The major issues that surfaced: the difficulty of working with partners who see your organization as a competing organization and finding ideas for outreach projects. Ms. Vargas asked if there was a need for a forum, listserv, or other resource for people to share outreach ideas. There was some discussion on the topic, but no consensus.

Actionable feedback received from exhibit visitors:

Over 50 people visited the booth at the Joint Conference of Librarians of Color (JCLC) and thanked NLM for contributing to the conference. Funding the scholarships made NLM a major focus of the conference. Individuals were sincerely interested in what NLM had to offer. It would be good to consider other opportunities to use sponsorship to bring attention to NLM for professional organizations that are not aware of NLM's products and services. The most popular materials at the JCLC booth were the diversity brochures created by Siobhan Champ-Blackwell that were revised to include all NN/LM offices. These brochures will be made available on the Clearinghouse and should be promoted on Regional websites.

At the SCC/MLA annual meeting, several people commented that adding one library icon to the top of the AbstractPlus page on PubMed would be worse than having none at all. When all icons are at the bottom of the page, at least the people *looking* for them will find them. If one icon is at the top of the page, no one will have a reason to look at the bottom to see if there are other icons, not even the people who are looking for icons.

During the SCC/MLA annual meeting, many of the libraries that have been awarded Go Local projects commented that they wish they had known that they would write quarterly reports to submit to the NLM, indefinitely. Also, the Resource Libraries that are not willing to do a Go Local project specifically said that the main reason they would not do one is the lack of continued support from NLM for an ongoing project.

MedlinePlus Go Local:

The NLM approved the *Louisiana Go Local* proposal submitted by the Baton Rouge General Medical Center, Baton Rouge, LA. The proposal covers the state of Louisiana.

Activities taken to promote MedlinePlus Go Local coverage in the Region:

- Ms. Vargas gave an overview of the Go Local application process at the Resource Library Director's meeting, August, 2006.
- Ms. Vargas met informally with the director of the El Paso Public Library and the librarian at the Pan American Health Organization El Paso Field Office at the Border Regional Library Association Fall Conference, El Paso, TX, about the possibility of the organizations collaborating on a Go Local project in West Texas. She will follow up on this discussion.
- Ms. Bougard presented information about the current Go Local projects and how to apply for Go Local funding in the NLM-NN/LM SCR Update at the SCC/MLA annual meeting.

- Ms. Vargas facilitated a roundtable called "Go Local, Not Loco" at the SCC/MLA annual meeting.
 Four of the five current Go Local projects had representatives at the roundtable to answer
 questions about doing Go Local projects. There were attendees from several organizations that
 are planning to prepare Go Local proposals.
- Ms. Vargas participated in a technology presentation on Go Local with Erinn Aspinall, Coordinator, Distance Services, from the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center Library and Informatics Center, Albuquerque, NM, at the SCC/MLA annual meeting. The presentation discussed all aspects of putting together a Go Local project, from the initial interest and proposal to the long-term maintenance. Approximately 25 people attended the presentation, and many were interested in doing a Go Local project.

Two significant changes occurred in Go Local Projects in this Region:

- 1. The team leader of Tribal Connections Four Corners Go Local, Paul Bracke, left the University of Arizona on August 31, 2006. At this time, no new leader has been named.
- Due to a sudden staff reduction, University of Texas Health Center at Tyler decided that it could
 no longer oversee the East Texas Go Local, east texas connect. Helen Miner, the Director of the
 Lake Country Area Health Education Center, Tyler, TX, has agreed to take on the position of
 project director. Robin Insalaco of Tyler Junior College, Tyler, TX, remains a co-coordinator of
 the project.
