The 20 member committee consists of academic health sciences librarians, hospital librarians, a public health professional, a representative from the Cherokee Nation, a public librarian, a high school media specialist, a professor from a school of library and information sciences, the state librarian, and the librarian from the Memorial Institute for the Prevention of Terrorism. Update of ongoing major projects (funded at ≥ \$15,000):

The Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center (HAM-TMC) Library, Houston, TX, continued work on its project *South Central Houston Community Health Information Center*. The project computers and network printer were received, installed, and made operational during this quarter. Signs were posted indicating that technical questions should be directed to the front desk at the Riverside facility and reference questions should be directed to the HAM-TMC Library. A demonstration/training session for six Riverside staff members was conducted April 18, 2008 and feedback from the session was positive. All attendees indicated they found the session to be a valuable experience.

The project investigators for the *Access to Electronic Consumer Health Information Award*, Santa Fe Indian Hospital, Santa Fe, NM, continue to schedule *eHealth* training sessions for the paraprofessionals in the Santa Fe Indian Hospital service area. Four training sessions were conducted for 33 paraprofessionals. The training sessions focused on searching for *eHealth* and identifying relevant and quality information on the web beyond MedlinePlus and other governmental web sites. The final reporting period of this subcontract has continued to demonstrate the value of the project. The expansion of the relationship with Laguna Pueblo has enabled the investigators to penetrate the behavioral health provider population more efficiently and more effectively. The inclusion of 1310 AM KKNS radio station is a crucial addition to the partnership roster for the investigators and will expand the *eHealth* reach to Spanish-speaking target populations. Finally, the development of a financial literacy program will tie the *eHealth* effort to sustained health improvement in underserved American Indian populations.

The Cherokee Nation, Tahlequah, OK, installed 15 computers in waiting rooms of Cherokee Nation clinics for the *Cherokee Health Information Project for Clinics*. The subcontractor has developed a *How to Search* book for consumers to guide them in conducting simple searches on various health topics that are placed next to these computers. The project investigator has done presentations at various meetings, including the Cherokee Nation Health Services Quality Control Council and Tribal Executive Leadership committee.

As part of the *New Mexico Partners in Public Health Project*, University of New Mexico Center for Development and Disability project, staff conducted three two-hour training sessions at the Santa Ana Pueblo with 18 in attendance. Participants included healthcare, library, indian health service, public

health community and education staff. Completed evaluations from training sessions demonstrate a high-level of satisfaction and increase of knowledge due to the sessions. Eighty-eight (88) percent of respondents reported they "strongly agree" that the training enhanced their ability to access and search for health information resources.

Project staff at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio Library, San Antonio, TX, continue to work on the *SMILE: Sharing MedlinePlus/MEDLINE for Information Literacy Education* project. Dentistry websites have been identified for inclusion on the proposed web page and the PHPartners.org website. Project staff met with dentists, dental hygienists and promotoras to introduce them to the project. A needs assessment survey was created to obtain feedback from project participants. The results of the survey identified Google as the most used information resource and participants were largely unaware of NLM databases.

The Department of Veterans Affairs, Alexandria, LA, *Technology Improvement Project*, was awarded in Year 01. They finished their project and submitted a final report on March 31, 2008. All equipment has been received and Ariel software installed. Ariel is operational on all sites except Houston which is having an issue with receiving documents. Houston is working on getting a static DSL line to solve the problem. Basic training and user guides were provided for Shreveport library staff during a site visit. Interlibrary loan statistics continue to be gathered in all sites for comparison of pre-and post-implementation of Ariel.

The Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center Library, Shreveport, LA, *NN/LM SCR Library Technology Award: Technical Proposal*, was awarded in Year 02 and has completed their second quarter of the project. The project site experienced serious problems with the Minolta PS5000C they purchased and after futile effort, the site had to propose an alternative equipment request and was approved.

Michelle Malizia presented several workshops to the public health workforce. On March 26, 2008, she made a presentation entitled *Locating Grants and Funding* for the Texas Public Health Association's Annual Conference in San Antonio, TX. Presentation attendees were provided with information on funding opportunities from the NN/LM SCR and NLM. On April 17, 2008, she taught two classes at the Texas Department of State Health Services: *Easy-to-Read Health and Wellness Materials* and *Grants and Proposal Writing*. Both classes were well attended. Ms. Malizia made three presentations at the National Student Nurses Association Annual Meeting held in Grapevine, TX on March 26-28, 2008. The first presentation, *Grants and Proposal Writing* was presented to nursing faculty. She also presented two separate sessions of *Will Duct Tape Cure My Warts* to all conference attendees.
