Period covered: May - July, 2007

Executive summary:

The NN/LM SCR officially implemented the State Liaison model on May 1. Karen Bülow is the State Liaison for AR and NM, and serves as interim State Liaison for LA until the Technology Coordinator position is filled. Karen Vargas is the State Liaison for Oklahoma, and Michelle Malizia is the State Liaison for TX. An informational piece describing the State Liaison model was made available to Network members on the NNLMSCR-L and *Blogadillo*, the NN/LM SCR blog.

Elizabeth Eaton began working with the Resource Library (RL) Directors, soliciting nominations for members to develop the state based Regional Advisory Committees for 2007-2009.

Thirteen of the 15 RLs signed outreach subcontracts which began on May 1, 2007 for Year 02. The Outreach Contacts from the RLs met in Houston on June 28, 2007 for the semi-annual Outreach Contacts meeting. NN/LM SCR staff apprised the Outreach Contacts on Year 02 NN/LM SCR Goals and Objectives related to outreach, changes to NLM products and services, and feedback was solicited from the Outreach Contacts on NLM and NN/LM SCR programs and services. Cindy Olney, NN/LM Outreach and Evaluation Resource Center (OERC), provided the Outreach Contacts with an evaluation session via teleconference and Adobe Connect during the meeting, in the absence of an NN/LM SCR Assessment and Programs Coordinator.

Interviews will be held in the next quarter for the NN/LM SCR Technology Coordinator position.

Update of ongoing major projects (funded at ≥ \$15,000): The project investigators, for the *Access to Electronic Consumer Health Information* Award, Santa Fe Indian Hospital, Santa Fe, NM, awarded on April 1, 2007, have performed awareness presentations for the project and it is available to all paraprofessionals in the Santa Fe Indian Hospital service area. The result of this effort has been the inclusion of oral health paraprofessionals and vision care professionals in the training sessions. Oral health care and vision care have been impacted by tighter federal budgets. Due to a reduction in staff, limited appointments are available and this has caused clinic clients to stop making appointments; thus their oral and vision care have lapsed. This is a significant health risk for many people in the service area. Diabetes, obesity and cardiovascular disease directly affect vision and oral health. The investigators have consulted with the clinical leaders of both disciplines and will begin providing *eHealth* training. The director of Optometry for the Albuquerque Area (all nine service units) has agreed to participate in this project. MedlinePlus.gov, PubMed.gov and other NN/LM products will be presented.

The Access to Electronic Consumer Health Information Award, Cherokee Health Information Network for Clinics (C.H.I.N.-II), Cherokee Nation, Tahleguah, OK is making progress. The Cherokee Nation has completed the order of 15 computers from Gateway Corporation. Delivery of these computers is expected by the end of September. The P.I. met with the Cherokee Nation IT support manager to develop a work plan and to schedule the installment of software and hardware at the designated clinic sites. The IT department assigned a hardware technician to this project and he will be responsible for the initial installation and technical support. As part of the plan to introduce and promote this project, the P.I has done presentations to the Cherokee Nation Health Services Quality Council (health advisory board), and to the tribal executive leadership committee. In addition similar presentations are planned for the medical and nursing staff and for the clinic administrators. The tribal newspaper, Cherokee Phoenix has interviewed the P.I for a story in an upcoming issue. A series of on-site training sessions for the medical, nursing and health administration staff are planned with University of Oklahoma College of Medicine – Tulsa Library, Tulsa, OK. The P.I. communicated with the clinics' staff to identify the best locations for computer placement, so the computers are in a prominent site and easily accessible to patients.

As part of the New Mexico *Partners in Public Health Information Outreach* award, the project staff has conducted a site visit with representatives from the Sandoval County Public Health Department to discuss the project and review the objectives. In addition, a design site assessment questionnaire form has been developed to ensure effective

facilitation and delivery of training for each site. Project training will begin in August, 2007.

The Department of Veterans Affairs, Alexandria, LA, *Technology Improvement Project*, was awarded in Year 01 and has just completed the second quarter of the project. The computer equipment and Ariel software has been ordered and is in the process of being installed in the various VA project sites in AR, LA, and TX.
