Administration Do you have any administrative concerns? What arrangements have you made to complete time reports, accident forms, fire report, etc.? Did all orders and procurement go through dispatch? ____Do you have any outstanding obligations? __Are all rental agreements and use records properly completed? __How did the fire start? If human-caused, has an investigation been initiated to determine the cause and develop a trespass case? _Do you know of any current or potential claims? **Dispatch Office** Is the incident receiving fire weather and fire behavior information? Is the incident getting the resources ordered in a timely manner? Is dispatch adequately staffed? What are the local, area, and national Preparedness Levels? How do they affect this fire?
