High End Instrumentation (HEI) Grant Applications

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

High End Instrumentation Grant Program (S10)

- Encourages applications from groups of NIH-supported investigators to purchase a single major item of equipment to be used for biomedical research that costs at least \$600,000.
- Maximum award is \$8,000,000.
- Funds should be expended expeditiously, within 18 to 24 months from the date of award.
- Instruments in this category include, but are not limited to, structural and functional imaging systems, macromolecular NMR spectrometers, high-resolution mass spectrometers, cryoelectron microscopes and supercomputers.
- Reviewers should not evaluate the scientific merit of the research project components, because these have been previously peer reviewed.
