

- Created by federal legislation (PL 106-554) in December 2000
 - Work with public & private sectors
 - Develop a strategy for collecting and providing long-term preservation and access to digital materials
- NDIIPP plan outlined in *Preserving Our Digital Heritage*
- Build network with matching grants;
 more than \$40 million awarded to date
- National Digital Strategy Advisory Board (NDSAB)






NDIIPP DIGITAL PRESERVATION STRATEGY






NETWORK: U.S. PARTNERS






NETWORK: PARTNER COMMUNITIES 2004






METWORK: PARTNER COMMUNITIES 2008

CONTENT: DOMAIN MAP









