Project Description: Since the 09/11/01 disaster, the 45th Security Forces Squadron, Combat Arms section has been responsible for providing small arms training for all base support organizations, as well as all tenant units. There are currently two 14-position firing ranges adjacent to each other (28 total). 14 of these have been shut down by Range Safety due to deteriorating baffles and other design deficiencies that do not completely trap live rounds during live-fire exercises. The remaining 14-point range is being used as an interim training facility using only frangible ammunition. A complete replacement of the outdoor range is required to meet the latest environmental and safety guidelines and tactical training mandates since 09/11/01. Currently, the 45th Combat Arms section provides training for over 2,200 personnel annually, with a 25% projected increase. Many of these personnel are deployed to overseas locations and are not receiving adequate combat training due to the lack of proper facilities. The continued loss of adequate combat arms and tactical training would cripple security force personnel's ability to provide force protection for the nation's Space Program. Additionally, lack of a permanent training facility will seriously degrade the capability of security forces personnel to adequately respond to potentially life threatening situations. Without a new range, training operations will continue to be inefficient due to environmental and safety concerns.

A single room is used for training, as an office and as a break room. In addition, ammunitions processing is performed 3 miles away due to lack of adequate space. Currently, there is no location to perform munitions trailer maintenance. The new and larger facility is critical for the 920 RQW to meet its wartime combat search and rescue (CSAR) mission. In addition, wing helicopters are being modified for the GAU-18 50 caliber machine gun, which the current facility cannot support. The maintenance bay is inadequate for more than 3 people to work in, due to most of the space being used for storage of the 2 current gun systems' support equipment. As the new 50 caliber system comes in, it will take up as much room as the other two systems, and the 920 RQW will be unable to support all 3 systems. Without the new Weapons Maintenance Facility, 920 RQW will be forced to continue weapons maintenance operations out of a facility that is well undersized. Mission will be impacted because the new GAU-18 weapon cannot be serviced in the existing facility.
