The Marine Mammal Commission has reviewed the notice regarding reporting requirements under the Marine Mammal Protection Act (74 Fed. Reg. 15459). As stated in the notice, section 118 of the Act mandates that the owner or operator of a vessel participating in a commercial fishery report any injuries to or deaths of marine mammals resulting from fishing activities. The information collected is needed to determine the impact of commercial fishing on marine mammal populations and is used to categorize commercial fisheries in one of three categories, according to their frequency of incidental take.

The incidental take, or bycatch, of marine mammals in fisheries is recognized as one of the most serious direct threats to marine mammal stocks. As such, the collection of this information is critical to meeting the goals of the Marine Mammal Protection Act and should be continued. According to the Service, the annual burden on respondents is minimal, and there is no cost to the public for this data collection program. Thus, the Commission sees no need to alter current reporting practices.
