# U. S. Senator Bill Nelson



Those individuals wishing to apply for nomination to one of the service academies must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Florida, and must never have been married. The U.S. Military Academy, Naval Academy, and Air Force Academy require that applicants must not have reached their 23rd birthday by July 1 of the year of admission. Candidates applying to the Merchant Marine Academy must be at least 17 and have not passed their 25th birthday on July 1 of the year of admission.

Due to the large number of applicants you will be interviewed for <u>only</u> one academy. Therefore, careful consideration should be given to your choice of an academy. Academy designation may be changed any time prior to September 20, 2009.

Each senator may have five Midshipmen or Cadets at each academy at any one time. For the 2010 admission year, Senator Nelson will be able to nominate 10 individuals for one vacancy per service academy. All applicants should be advised that acceptance of any appointment commits them to at least a five year active duty obligation to the military upon graduation.

The deadline for submission of information to the senator's office is September 20, 2009. Submissions postmarked after this date <u>will not</u> be accepted. Those individuals meeting eligibility requirements will be notified of the date, time, and place to report for a personal interview by the regional board (Fort Lauderdale, Orlando, Tallahassee, Tampa). Approximately nine board members are selected by Senator Nelson for each of the four regions. Members consist of business and community leaders, service academy graduates, active and retired military personnel and academia.

The review board will conduct a personal interview with each applicant who meets all requirements. Selections are made competitively on the basis of academic performances, leadership potential, personal statement, extra curricular activities, personal interviews and letters of recommendation. Ten nominees for each vacancy will be recommended to Senator Nelson by the state board. Senator Nelson will review and submit these recommendations to each service academy. Ten alternates for each vacancy also will be recommended to the senator. Alternates are not submitted unless requested by the academy. The final ranking and subsequent appointments will be at the discretion of the academies.

Officials at the academies advise individuals desiring nominations to request an application from the academy at the same time they seek nomination through Senator Nelson. Contact with the admissions office of the academy of your preference is imperative. Once contact is established, the academy will create a file for the candidate and transmit general information on the academy along with detailed admission requirements, including a Prospective Candidate Questionnaire.

#### PERSONAL INTERVIEW

All applicants meeting eligibility requirements and residing in Florida will be interviewed on **November 5**, **2009**, in either Fort Lauderdale, Orlando, Tallahassee or Tampa. This **compulsory** interview will be in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Academy Selection Board. Interviews will be conducted in person and prospective applicants should plan accordingly. The personal interview is a **mandatory** element of the application process. Special arrangements can be made with dependents of active-duty military personnel and students who reside outside Florida. **Note: Interviews are held for one day only (November 5, 2009).** 

#### SAT / ACT SCORES

The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and American College Testing Assessment Test (ACT) are the most important academic requirements of the academies. As a general rule, no combined score below 1570 will be considered competitive. Senator Nelson's SAT code is 0220 and ACT code is 7118. If they are not noted on your official academic transcript, SAT and ACT scores may be forwarded directly from the testing center to Senator Nelson's office located at 225 East Robinson Street, Suite 410, Orlando FL 32801. Should you receive an invitation for an interview, please bring any updated test scores with you. NOTE: Minimum SAT and ACT scores must be met by the postmarked deadline of September 20, 2009 to be eligible for an interview with Senator Nelson's nominating board.

# **Helpful Hints For Completing Your Application**



Follow directions carefully. All applications materials must be submitted at the same time.
When approaching individuals who will provide information for your application, let them know you need the information back in a signed, sealed envelope. Additionally, let them know your application must be submitted with all supporting documents.
All staples, binders, jackets, plastic sleeves, report covers or other materials used to assemble applications are removed prior to presenting them to board members for review. It not necessary to use any presentation materials when assembling your application. Again, all items will be removed and discarded.
Remember to return the Academy checklist with your application materials. It must be completed and is a part of the application.
Applications received without all supporting documents are considered incomplete.
Once your application is received and processed, a notification letter with the status of your application will be mailed. Based on the volume of applications received, this process can take several weeks.
Official SAT or ACT test scores are accepted directly from the testing facility or as listed on your high school transcripts. Student copies are not accepted as official test scores.
The application listed on the website ( <a href="http://billnelson.senate.gov/services/nominations.cfm">http://billnelson.senate.gov/services/nominations.cfm</a> ) is a fill-in form. This means that you may type directly into the application, print and sign it to prepare for mailing.
Applications received at office locations other than the Orlando, Florida office may be delayed. The U. S. Senate's mail security policy for all Washington, D. C. offices remains in effect. This policy requires that all mail must go through an irradiation process before it can be received and opened. Consequently, mail sent directly to the Washington, D. C. office may not be received for four to six weeks.
Applications sent to other office locations will be forwarded to the Orlando office. However, there is no guarantee the application will arrive prior to the postmark deadline. If your application is sent to a location other than the Orlando, is forwarded and arrives in Orlando after the postmark deadline, it may be considered late and possibly will not be accepted.
