Facilitator Program

**All of our FY09 training programs are currently fully staffed with facilitators.

The Inspector General Criminal Investigator Academy (IG Academy) routinely utilizes facilitators who act as mentors and assist students in the overall learning process during basic training programs. This is a well-established best practice in law enforcement training that adds value to the training and benefits the facilitator, the students and the IG Academy staff. The IG Academy utilizes facilitators who are experienced criminal investigators from the IG community whose agency has agreed to support the IG Academy's training programs.

Facilitators should have 7 or more years of criminal investigator experience and at least five years in an OIG. Graduation from the Criminal Investigator Training Program (CITP) and either the IG-ITP or the IG-Transitional Training Program (IG_TTP) are also prerequisites. The IG Academy funds facilitator travel costs from tuition.
