

As you know, the York plant is the company's largest assembly facility, employing over 2,000 workers and supporting many more at Harley-Davidson dealerships throughout the region. Last year, Harley-Davidson dealers contributed nearly half a billion dollars to the state economy.


It is our understanding that various options are being considered in order to improve the long-term competitiveness of Harley-Davidson, including a closure or scale-back of the operations in York.
