Juliet Asante

Juliet Asante, a native of Ghana, is the founder and CEO of Eagle Productions Ltd., a prominent production company on the Ghanaian television scene; she also heads the Eagle Drama College, a subsidiary. Ms. Asante is the founder and the director of Save Our Women International and serves as president of Women in Film and Television Ghana (WIFT). She currently writes and directs one of the nation's most successful TV soap operas, *Secrets*. An alumna of the State Department/Fortune mentorship program and editor of the *Entertainment Today Magazine*, she won an award from the Ghana Film Industry for Best Actress in 2001 and acted in the HBO feature film, *Deadly Voyage*. Ms. Asante is a member of the World Economic Forum's entertainment council. Educated in Ghana, she also earned a diploma in acting from the New York Film Academy.

As part of the 2008 <u>FORTUNE/U.S. State Department Global Women's</u> <u>Mentoring Partnership</u>, Ms. Asante had the opportunity to be mentored by Pat Mitchell, the President and CEO of the <u>Paley Center for Media</u>. As a result of her mentorship, Juliet has become a more "focused leader" and has used that focus to help empower Ghanian women through the establishment of the ET Women Empowerment Club.
