- 1. The Environmental Programs Directorate (DAIM-ED) developed and coordinated the SRP Matrix process. The Facilities & Housing Directorate (DAIM-FDF and DAIM-FDC); Plans & Operations Division (DAIM-ZS); G-3 Training, Simulations & Support Division (DAMO-TRS); and G-4 Munitions Division (DALO-SMA) participated in the clarification and modification of funding responsibility language for their respective program areas. The Environmental Law Division (JALS-EL) participated when needed to clarify interpretations of legal requirements.
- 2. DAIM-ED in coordination with the other organizations used a four-step methodology to target topics for clarification and then develop consensus guidance revisions for recommended approval:
 - Identified and documented environmentally-related requirements specifically for range sustainment.
 - Identified and analyzed current policy/funding documents.
 - Identified program gaps, overlaps, and policy questions requiring resolution.
 - Facilitated ARSTAF discussions to resolve the identified gaps, overlaps and policy questions.
- 3. A series of eight ARSTAF workgroup meetings were held beginning on 22 Sep 04 and culminating 2 Feb 05. Several smaller meetings and multiple individual conversations were held to develop language to align funding responsibilities to the most appropriate organizations.
- 4. On 9 Mar 05 the ARSTAF met with representatives from HQ Installation Management Agency, US Army Environmental Center, and National Guard to coordinate the SRP matrix. Their comments from this meeting were incorporated into the SRP matrix.
- 5. To date, 14 issues have been resolved among DAIM-ED, DAIM-FDF, DAIM-FDC, and DAIM-ZS. We will continue to work toward resolution on the other identified issues.
