

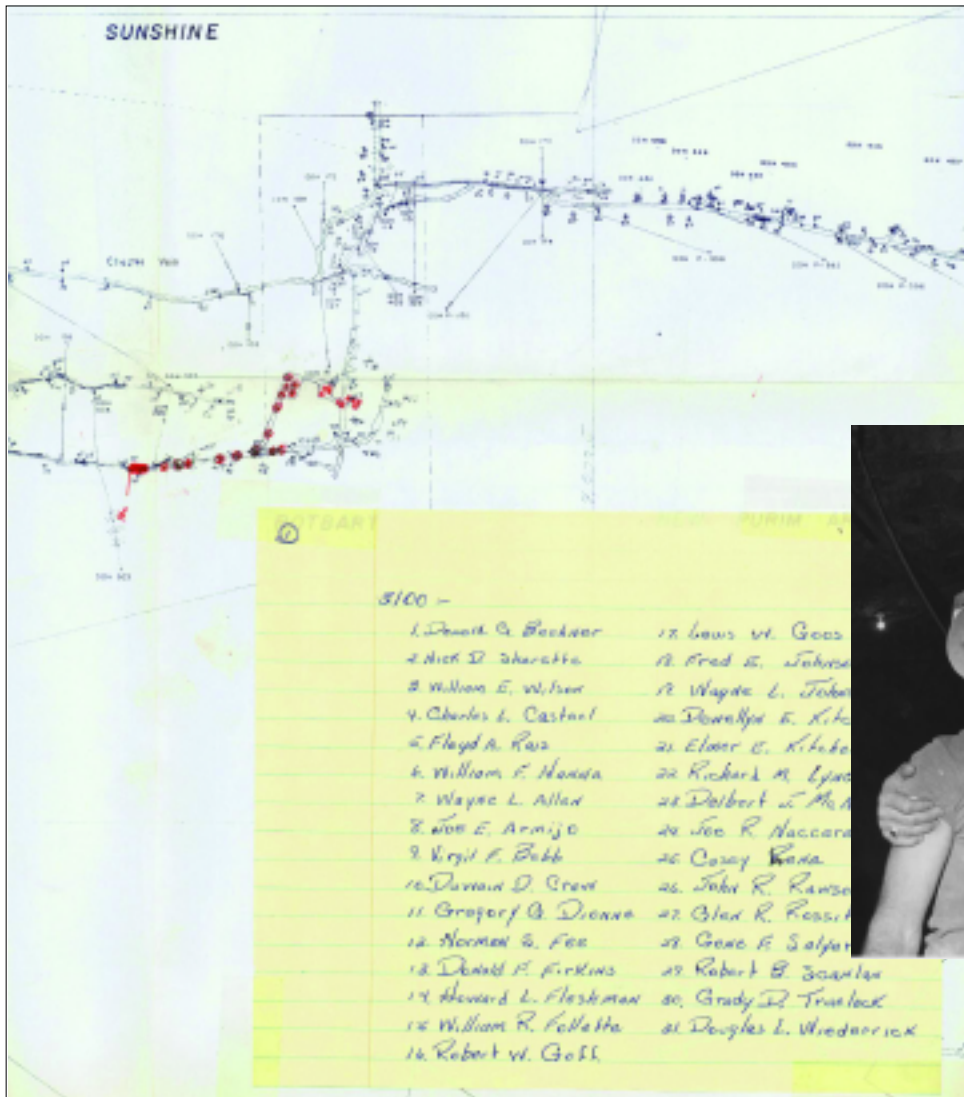

The Sunshine Mine

The Sunshine Mine, located approximately 8 miles from Kellogg, Idaho, was the nation's premier silver producer for many years. On May 2, 1972, a fire of an undetermined origin was detected in the nearly 6,000 foot deep mine. Of the 173 men who were underground that morning, 80 were evacuated at the immediate onset of the fire but 91 underground

employees died as a result of smoke inhalation and/or carbon monoxide poisoning. Eight days after the fire started, Ron Flory and Tom Wilkerson were found on the 4800 foot level of the mine near a fresh air source, the only 2 survivors to be found. The Sunshine Mine fire remains one of America's worst hard rock mine disasters.
