Outstanding Plant Materials Team Award – Aberdeen, Idaho Plant Materials Center The Aberdeen Plant Materials Center is recognized for its continued efforts in 2008 to provide outstanding technical assistance and support to the Intermountain West and beyond. The PMC and its staff consistently excel in all they do and exemplify the excellence of NRCS and the Plant Materials Program.
