Last Friday, I helped to pass the Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2009 (CHIP). This bill will make it possible for 10 million new low income children to receive healthcare across the country. Funding in Washington state will increase to \$94 million, allowing 6,000 more uninsured children to access healthcare. This bill ensures that children like Brenna Krug, a young girl from Marysville, WA suffering from Cystic Fibrosis, can afford care. – <u>Details</u>
