<u>Financial Literacy</u>: Introduction of the Financial and Economic Literacy Improvement Act of 2009

Earlier this month, I introduced legislation that would support efforts to provide financial literacy education to Americans of all ages in our schools and colleges. This bill would provide \$250 million in annual grants to states to support the teaching of financial literacy in K-12 and 2-and 4-year colleges. I strongly believe that if we intend to avoid the mistakes that led to this crisis, we have to give our students the knowledge and skills necessary to make sound financial decisions.
