ORDER OF PROHIBITION

Pursuant to Section 206(i)(1)(C) of the Federal Credit Union Act ("FCUA"), 12 U.S.C. §1786(i)(1)(C), you are hereby notified that you are prohibited from participating in any manner in the affairs of any federally insured credit union. This prohibition results from your conviction for activities you engaged in during your affiliation with Advantage One Credit Union, Morrison, IL.

This prohibition is effective immediately upon service. In accordance with Section 206(g)(7)(A) of the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. § 1786(g)(7)(A), this Order shall constitute a prohibition from further participation in any manner in the affairs of any federally insured financial institution, or other entity identified therein, without the written permission of the appropriate federal regulatory agency. This Order has been issued based upon the following information: You were convicted of Bank Fraud, 18 U.S.C. § 1344 and Money Laundering 18 U.S.C. § 1956 (a)(1)(B)(i). On February 8, 2008, you were sentenced by the United States District Court for the Northern District of lowa to

restitution totaling \$337,215.78 to Advantage One Credit Union and CUMIS Insurance Society, Inc.

You committed the offenses to which you were convicted in your capacity as Branch Manger of Advantage One Credit Union. Due to the nature of the offenses to which you were convicted your continued participation in the affairs of any federally insured credit union may pose a threat to the interests of credit union members and may threaten to impair public confidence in the credit union involved.

NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to Section 206(i)(3), of the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. § 1786(i)(3), you may request in writing, within thirty days of service of this Order, an opportunity for a hearing at which you may present evidence and argument that your continued participation in the affairs of any federally insured credit union would not, or would not be likely to, pose a threat to the interests of that credit union's members or threaten to impair public confidence in the credit union. Pursuant to 12 C.F.R. § 747.306, your request must state with particularity the relief desired, the grounds, and must include, when available, supporting evidence.

Any such request shall be sent to: Secretary of the Board, National Credit Union Administration, 1775 Duke Street, Alexandria, Virginia 22314-3428, with a copy sent to Associate General Counsel, John K. Ianno at the same address. The hearing will be held in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, in accordance with Subpart D of Part 747 of the National Credit Union Administration's Rules and Regulations, 12 C.F.R. § 747.301 *et. seq.* You may appear at the hearing personally, through counsel, or personally with counsel. The proceedings will be recorded and you will be entitled to a transcript after payment of the costs thereof. Witnesses may be called in the discretion

of the NCUA Board. If witnesses are permitted, you may cross examine any witnesses called by the NCUA's enforcement staff, and they in turn may cross-examine any witnesses called by you. The Presiding Officer of the hearing will make his or her recommendations to the NCUA Board, where possible, within ten business days following the close of the record.

PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF ORDER OF PROHIBITION

Pursuant to Section 206(k)(2) of the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. § 1786(k)(2), any violation of this Order may subject you to a civil money penalty. In addition, pursuant to Section 206(l) of the Federal Credit Union Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1786(l), any violation of this Order is a felony offense that is punishable by imprisonment of up to five years and a fine of up to \$1,000,000.

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of: 3 years. This term consists of 3 years on all of the Counts of the Indictment, to be served concurrently.

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall register with the state sex offender registration agency in the state where the defendant resides, works, or is a student, as directed by the probation officer. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall participate in an approved program for domestic violence. (Check, if applicable.)

If this judgment imposes a fine or restitution, it is a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of this judgment,

The defendant must comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court as well as with any additional conditions on the attached page.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- the defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer;
- 2) the defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month;
- the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment; 6)
- the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement 11) officer;
- the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

The defendant must comply with the following special conditions as ordered by the Court and implemented by the U.S. Probation Office:

- 1. The defendant must pay any financial penalty that is imposed by this judgment.
- 2. The defendant must provide the U.S. Probation Office with access to any requested financial information.
- 3. The defendant must not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the U.S. Probation Office unless he is in compliance with the installment payment schedule.
- 4. The defendant must not accept or maintain any employment in which you would have access to money or assume a fiduciary position. Further, she must allow your probation officer to notify her employer of her current criminal status.
- 5. The defendant must obtain verifiable employment that must be pre-approved by her probation officer. In addition, she must not be self-employed in any field related to loans or investments. Further, she must allow her probation officer to notify her employer of her current criminal status.
- The defendant must participate in a mental health evaluation and/or treatment program. She must take all medications prescribed to her by a licensed psychiatrist or physician.

The defendant shall also notify the United States Attorney within 30 days of any change of mailing or residence address that occurs while any portion of the restitution remains unpaid.
