## FLOOR SCHEDULE AND BILL SUMMARY

Conference Report on H.R. 3057 – Foreign Operations Appropriations Act for FY06 (*Rep. Kolbe – Appropriations*) (*Subject to a Rule*). This conference report provides \$20.9 billion including: \$4.76 billion for military assistance (\$2.3 billion for Israel, \$1.3 billion for Egypt, and \$210 million for Jordan); \$1.61 billion for multilateral economic assistance (\$1.03 billion for the World Bank, \$100 million for the Asian Development Bank, \$329 million for International Organizations); \$14.57 billion for bilateral economic assistance (\$2.63 billion for the Economic Support Fund, \$1.52 billion for the Development Assistance Fund, \$1.58 billion for the Child Survival Fund, \$1.77 billion for the Millennium Challenge Corporation, \$734 million for the Andean Counterdrug Initiative; and \$791 million for Migration and Refugee Assistance). The conference report provides a total of \$2.82 billion for global assistance to combat HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria.

The Rules Committee has recommended a closed rule that provides for one hour of general debate and waives all points of order against the conference report and against its consideration.
