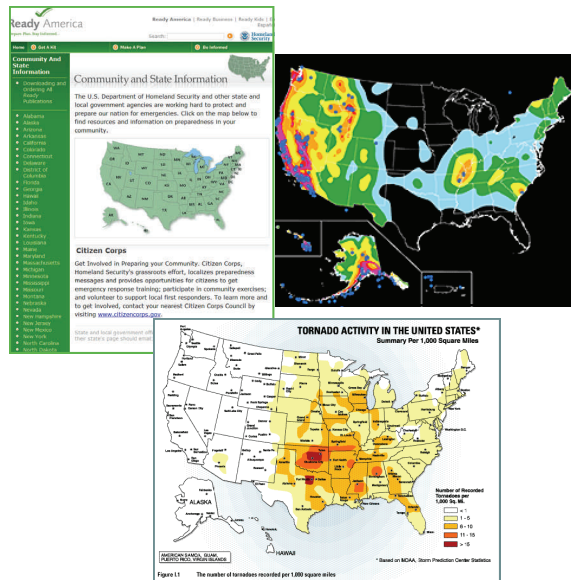


HOW CAN I USE IT?

The toolkit can help you learn about the steps required to develop an emergency preparedness and response plan for your library. It provides you with templates for disaster plans...

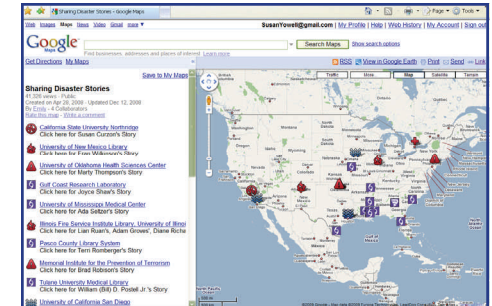


...and links to resources outside the site that will help you conduct a risk assessment, plan for service continuity in an emergency, and know where to get help with handling damaged library materials.
