FACT SHEET

- Open World has hosted more than 14,400 Eurasian leaders in the United States since the program's inception in 1999.
- In 2007, Open World expanded to include the countries of Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, and Tajikistan. Kazakhstan and Turkmenistan programs began in 2008. Open World has also hosted delegations from Belarus, Lithuania, and Uzbekistan.
- Representing all **83 regions**, more than **12,900** individuals from the Russian Federation have participated in the program, with most hosted in the areas of accountable governance, social issues, and the rule of law.
- Since 2003, over **860** leaders have come from Ukraine for programs on accountable governance, NGO development, the rule of law, and media issues.
- The average age of Open World delegates is **38**; over half are women.
- More than **60** percent of Open World delegates have been federal, regional, or local government officials.
- Over 2,000 Russian and Ukrainian judges and legal professionals have been hosted in U.S. courts and communities as part of Open World visits focused on the rule of law. In addition, 59 judges have participated from the countries of Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, and Turkmenistan.
- 147 U.S. federal and state judges have hosted their counterparts from Russia, Ukraine, Kyrgyzstan, and Georgia.
- Open World has brought 153 members of the Russian Federation Council and State Duma to the United States. Ten percent of the current Russian State Duma are Open World alumni.
- 52 U.S. senators, representatives, and state governors have hosted Open World participants.
- Since November 2003, over **300** cultural leaders from Russia have participated in Open World's cultural program in the areas of music, dance, writing, film, and historic preservation.
- Some 6,000 families in 1,700 host communities in all 50 states and the District of Columbia have home-hosted Open World participants.
- California has welcomed over 1,150 Open World participants. New York, Wisconsin, and the District of Columbia have hosted over 830 participants; Iowa and North Carolina have hosted over 700.
- Open World has organized over 50 major alumni events throughout Russia. Program alumni are also active in Ukraine and the expansion countries.
- Total funding appropriated for the Open World Program from 1999 through fiscal year 2009 is \$127.11 million.
