Announcing the new NLM Applied Informatics Grants

On September 26, 2008, the National Library of Medicine (NLM) announced the suspension of two informatics grant programs, "Planning Grants for Integrated Advanced Information Management Systems (IAIMS)" and "Knowledge Management & Applied Informatics Grants." The suspension notices also stated that in the future NLM would solicit applications for knowledge management planning projects by means of a Request for Application (RFA) funding announcement rather than a standing funding announcement. NLM has now released the complete program announcement and first RFA for knowledge management grants with the new funding program, NLM Applied Informatics Grants, The announcement includes complete eligibility information, key dates for submission deadlines, and application review criteria.

NLM Applied Informatics Grants are offered to help health-related and scientific organizations use information technology to optimize the utility and use of clinical and research information. These grants are designed for organizations wishing to exploit the capabilities of information technology to bring usable and useful biomedical knowledge to end users by translating the findings of informatics and information science research into practice through novel or enhanced systems and services. NLM Applied Informatics grant projects must result in an operational service activity. This may involve installation of a whole system, the testing of a prototype followed by a fuller implementation, establishing connectivity of existing system components, or enhancing features of an existing system or resource. These grants are not merely for technology or online access to publications.

NLM anticipates making 3–5 awards and spending approximately \$800,000 for the first year to support this program. Awards are contingent upon the availability of funds and the submission of a sufficient number of meritorious applications. Individual awards may not exceed \$150,000 for one year, \$300,000 over two years or \$450,000 over three years, in direct costs. The total amount requested need not be the same in each year of a multi-year project. The project period can be one to three years. This program does not cover costs for facilities and administration, also called overhead or indirect costs.

This RFA is a *one-time opportunity*, with a *single application deadline*. The deadline for receipt of letters of intent is June 1, 2009, and applications are due by *July 1, 2009*. Applications will be reviewed during the fall of 2009 and the earliest anticipated project starting date is April 2010. Applications must be submitted electronically through <u>Grants.gov</u>.

The program officer for this funding opportunity is <u>Dr. Hua-Chuan Sim</u>. Potential grant applicants may contact him to discuss ideas and how projects can best fit into the goals of the grant program. And of course feel free to consult or discuss grant ideas with NN/LM librarians!
