

# **EMPLOYMENT AND TRENDS OF FEDERAL CIVILIAN WORKFORCE STATISTICS SEPTEMBER 2002**

This section contains recent data “as of” the date shown on the report cover. Selected tables also contain data for the previous month.

**EMPLOYMENT AND TRENDS** is available on a bi-monthly basis; however, data not contained in the report will be furnished upon request. To request data, cite the table(s) number needed and send requests in writing to: U.S. Office of Personnel Management, Theodore Roosevelt Building (Room 7439), 1900 E Street, NW, Washington, DC 20415-6000.

The personnel summaries in **Table 1 and 17** present highlights of the information in **Tables 2-16 and 18-31**. **Table 2** compares the current and previous month's Federal civilian employment by branch, agency, and area. **Tables 3-6 and 16** include 13-month trends for employment, payrolls, Executive Branch employment by work schedule, and turnover.

Employment figures reflect an on-board “head count” of the workforce at the end of the report period. Monthly payroll varies from 20 to 30 workdays depending upon the report cycle. This includes all salary and wages paid to all employees working during the month regardless of whether or not they were on-board at the end of the month.

Due to the lag in reporting of transfers and variations in agency reporting periods, the net difference in turnovers (accessions and separations) may not necessarily balance with net monthly changes in employment. For example, a former agency does not prepare a separation personnel action for an employee who transfers to another agency until an accession notice is received from the new agency.

Where figures are expressed in thousands, each is rounded independently and not forced to add to rounded totals. All figures are subject to revision. Several tables present employment data for the Washington, DC-MD-VA-WV

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). The Washington, DC-Maryland-Virginia-West Virginia MSA includes the District of Columbia; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, Prince William, Stafford, and Clarke, Culpeper, Fauquier, King

George, Spotsylvania, and Warren Counties; and the Cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Manassas, Manassas Park, and Fredericksburg in Virginia; Calvert, Charles, Frederick, Montgomery, and Prince Georges Counties in Maryland; and Berkeley and Jefferson Counties in West Virginia.


## **SPECIAL NOTE TO READERS REGARDING EXECUTIVE BRANCH EMPLOYMENT CONTROLS**

The employment data contained in this report represent on-board “head count” strength which differs from full-time equivalent employment (FTE) figures primarily used by Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to manage an agency's personnel ceilings. Beginning in Fiscal Year 1982, the full-time equivalent (FTE) **resource management system** replaced the Executive Branch numerical end-of-year personnel ceilings that had been used to control the size of the Federal workforce for many years. Under the FTE system, workforce estimates assigned to agencies are based on the number of work years required to achieve agency missions and objectives. (One work year is equivalent to 2,080 hours of work which could mean, for example, one employee on a full-time schedule of 40 hours for 52 weeks, or two part-time employees for 20 hours per week each for the same period.) The work year estimate assigned is based on the maximum cumulative number of hours that can be worked by **all** employees covered by employment controls, including full-time, part-time, and intermittent employees. Work years or (FTE) are not defined as employee “head counts” and should not be confused with employment levels and trends. OMB assigns and controls the work year estimates. None of the data presented in this Section reflects work years or FTE.



# Distribution of Federal Civilian Employment by Branch



September 2002





# Distribution of Federal Civilian Employment by Work Schedule/Appointment



# Full-Time Federal Civilian Employment in White- and Blue-Collar Occupations as of September 30, 2001

## Employment Totals

There were 1,684,919 full-time non-postal Federal civilian employees covered by the most recent occupational survey as of September 30, 2001. (The survey's data sources are described below.) Most workers were in professional, scientific, administrative, and support-type jobs commonly referred to as white-collar occupations (1,468,794 or 87 percent); the remaining workers were in blue-collar occupations (216,125 or 13 percent). Women comprised 49 percent of white-collar employment and 9 percent of blue-collar employment.

## Major Geographic Areas

Federal white-collar employees worked around the world, but 97 percent (1,419,651) worked in the United States; 17 percent (256,612) worked in the Washington, DC-MD-VA-WV Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)\* and 3 percent (49,143) worked in foreign countries and U.S. territories. Federal blue-collar workers were also employed primarily in the United States (212,725 or 98 percent) with only 6 percent (13,399) in the Washington, DC-MD-VA-WV MSA; the other 3,400 blue-collar workers (2 percent) were overseas. **Figure 1** shows the

distribution of full-time Federal workers by major geographic areas.


## Average Annual Salaries

Average annual salary data are based on basic rates of pay including any locality area pay adjustments. The average annual salary of white-collar employees was \$55,061 as of September 30, 2001. Average annual salaries are generally higher in the Washington, DC-MD-VA-WV MSA than elsewhere since most agencies have their headquarters and senior managers in the Nation's Capital; the average white-collar salary in the Washington, DC-MD-VA-WV MSA was \$68,757. The worldwide average salary for the blue-collar workforce was \$39,328.

## Major Agencies

The Department of Defense employed 33 percent of Federal civilian white-collar workers: Army (169,704), Navy (136,230), Air Force (103,546), Defense Logistics Agency (16,643), and other Defense agencies (64,687). The four other major employers of white-collar workers were the Departments of Veterans Affairs (175,294), Treasury (137,669), Justice (118,828), and Agriculture (97,503).

More than two-thirds of blue-collar workers were employed by Defense agencies: Army (47,784), Navy (42,186), Air Force (48,339), Defense Logistics Agency (6,277), and other Defense agencies (4,675). Other major blue-collar employers were Veterans Affairs (25,646), Interior (10,578), Justice (5,424), and Tennessee Valley Authority (5,365).

## White-Collar Occupations

White-collar workers are classified into more than 400 different occupations organized into 23 groups. For example, the Legal and Kindred Group includes the occupation General Attorney. The following **Table A** distributes full-time Federal civilian employment in white-collar occupations as of September 30, 2001, by group, occupation, major geographic area, and gender. Each occupation is also identified by an occupational category: Professional, Administrative, Technical, Clerical, Other (asterisk indicates a multiple category). Nearly one quarter of white-collar workers (356,916 or 24 percent) were in the General Administrative, Clerical, and Office Services Group. The other large white-collar groups were: Medical, Hospital, Dental, and Public Health (144,968 or 10 percent); Engineering and Architecture (121,536 or 8 percent); Accounting and Budget (112,402 or 8 percent); Investigation (97,867 or 7 percent); Business and Industry (92,464 or 6 percent); and Legal and Kindred (90,066 or 6 percent). **Figure 2** shows the distribution of full-time Federal workers by occupational group.

## Blue-Collar Occupations

The various kinds of work performed by blue-collar employees have been defined in some 350 different occupations that are organized into 37 job family groups. The following **Table B** distributes full-time

Federal civilian employment in blue-collar occupations as of September 30, 2001, by group, occupation, major geographic area, and gender.

Three of every four blue-collar employees (161,778 or 75 percent) worked in the following 12 occupational groups: General Maintenance and Operation (20,336); Warehousing and Stock Handling (19,261); General Services and Support Work (16,380); Transportation/Mobile Equipment Maintenance (15,850); Electronic Equipment Installation and Maintenance (14,044); Aircraft Overhaul (13,987); Transportation/ Mobile Equipment Operation (12,974); Food Preparation and Serving (11,344); Electrical Installation and Maintenance (11,018); Industrial Equipment Maintenance (10,039); Metal Work (8,973); and Industrial Equipment Operation (7,572).

## Data Sources

The primary source for these data was the Central Personnel Data File (CPDF), augmented by submissions from seven agencies for use in the occupational survey. No data were collected from Members and employees of Congress, Congressional Budget Office, General Accounting Office, U.S. Court of Appeals to Veterans Claims, Commission on Security and Cooperation in Europe, Judicial Branch, White House Office, Office of the Vice President, Office of Policy Development, Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, U.S. Postal Service, Postal Rate Commission, Central Intelligence Agency, National Security Agency, Defense Intelligence Agency, National Imagery and Mapping Agency, Army/Air Force Exchange Service, Consolidated Metropolitan Technical Personnel Center, Defense Career Management and Support Agency, Public Health Service's Commissioned Corps, and foreign nationals employed overseas.

**Figure 2. Full-Time Federal Civilian Employment by Occupational Group**



# DATA SOURCE, DEFINITIONS, AND ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

## INTRODUCTION

Statistics in this report are based on the *Monthly Report of Federal Civilian Employment* (Standard Form 113A). Each department and agency of the Federal Government, except the Central Intelligence Agency, the National Security Agency, National Imagery and Mapping Agency, and the Defense Intelligence Agency, submit statistical data. This report also does not include uniformed military personnel. The Office of Personnel Management does not collect personnel data from any State or local government including the District of Columbia government. Within this report, employment data are reported under the following categories:

## WORK SCHEDULES

**Full-time employees** - those employees who are regularly scheduled to work the number of hours and days required by the administrative workweek for their employment group or class. (Most full-time employees have an administrative workweek of 5 days of 8 hours each.)

**Part-time employees** - those employees who are regularly employed on a prearranged scheduled tour of duty that is less than the specified hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.

**Intermittent employees** - those employees who are employed on an irregular or occasional basis, with hours or days of work not on a prearranged schedule, and with compensation only for the time actually employed or for services actually rendered. As of January 1979, an intermittent employee who separated prior to the as-of-date of the report is not counted.

## POSITIONS

**Permanent position** - one which has been established without time limit, or for a period of a year or more, or which, in any event, has been occupied for a year or more (regardless of the intent when it was established).

**Temporary position** - one that has been established for a limited period of less than a year and which has not been occupied for more than a year.

## COMPETITIVE SERVICE

The competitive service consists of all civil service positions in the Executive Branch except: (a) positions that are specifically excepted from the competitive service by or under statute; (b) positions to which appointments are made by nomination for confirmation by the Senate, unless the Senate otherwise directs, and (c) positions in the Senior Executive Service. The competitive service also includes civil service positions outside the Executive Branch that are specifically included in the competitive service by statute.

## EXCEPTED SERVICE AND SENIOR EXECUTIVE SERVICE

Title IV of the Civil Service Reform Act of 1978 created the Senior Executive Service (SES). Personnel in the Executive Branch in managerial positions classifiable above GS-15 of the General Schedule (GS) and not designated above level IV of the Executive Schedule, or their equivalents, are in the SES. Exceptions include positions in government corporations, intelligence agencies, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and administrative law judges. The Foreign Service Act of 1980 created a Senior Foreign Service, effective February 15, 1981, which parallels the Senior Executive Service in most respects.

Federal employees who are not in the competitive service or SES are in the excepted service. Examples of excepted positions include the entire U.S. Postal Service, Vietnam Era Veterans serving under Veterans Readjustment Act Appointments, positions for which it is not practical to hold competitive examinations such as teachers in dependents' schools overseas and attorneys, positions of a policy-determining and confidential nature, and most positions in the Legislative and Judicial Branches. Foreign nationals holding jobs overseas are excepted by Executive Order.

Several tables in this report show the number of Federal civilian employees in the competitive service and in the excepted service.

Senior Executive Service employment is included with the excepted service in **EMPLOYMENT AND TRENDS** since both excepted service and Senior Executive Service data are reported together on the 113A monthly report.

## APPOINTMENTS

**Permanent Appointments** - include employees who are (1) in the competitive service who hold career appointments and who either have completed probation or are not required to serve probation; (2) in the competitive service who hold career-conditional appointments, or who hold career appointments and are serving probation; (3) in the excepted service whose appointments carry no restrictions such as conditional, indefinite, specific time limitations, or trial periods; (4) in the excepted service who are serving trial periods or whose tenure is equivalent to career-conditional tenure in the competitive service; and (5) in the Senior Executive Service (SES) who are not serving under “limited term and limited emergency” appointments.

**Temporary and Indefinite Appointments** - include all other employees who do not fall within any of the classifications described under Permanent Appointments.

## CITIZENSHIP

**Citizens** - direct hire employees who owe allegiance to the United States by birth or naturalization regardless of their place of permanent residence or duty station.

**Non-Citizens - Territories** - direct hire employees who are citizens of another country and whose duty station is in the Territories of the United States (American Samoa, Baker Island, Guam, Howland Island, Jarvis Island, Johnston Atoll, Kingman Reef, Midway Islands (except Ryukyu Islands and Swan Islands), Navassa Islands, Northern Mariana Islands, Palmyra Atoll, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Wake Island).

**Non-Citizens - Foreign Countries** - (commonly referred to as “foreign nationals”) direct hire employees who are citizens of another country and whose duty station is not the United States or its Territories.

Note: Federal civilian employees (citizens and non-citizens) are direct hire employees, i.e., they are under agreement or contract with the U.S. Government. Indirect hires (persons who, under agreement or contract with **foreign governments**, provide personal services to the U.S. Government) are not Federal civilian employees, and are not included in any employment figures in the **EMPLOYMENT AND TRENDS**.

## PAYROLL

Payroll is the sum of all wages, salaries and lump sum payments earned by Federal civilian employees. Wages and salaries include gross base pay, overtime, night differential, and holiday pay. Lump sum payments are monies paid for annual leave to employees who have separated from the Federal Government. Payroll data are collected and presented in thousands of dollars.

Please note that, while monthly employment data reflect on-board “head count” employment as of the end of the report period, payroll data reflect salary and wages for all employees who *worked during the period*, whether or not they were on board at the end of the month. Moreover, “monthly” payroll data could cover from 20 to 30 workdays depending on the report cycle. Hence, payroll data is not tied directly to employment figures. Therefore, average salaries, for example, *cannot* be calculated based on these monthly data.

## ACCESSIONS AND SEPARATIONS

Accessions include appointments from civil service registers which are career or career-conditional appointments, excepted appointments, appointments to the Senior Executive Service, temporary appointments from registers, temporary appointments pending the establishment of registers, reappointments, reinstatements, restorations and returns to duty, and transfers. Separations include quits, discharges, terminations, reductions in force, removals, transfers, extended leave without pay, suspensions, furloughs, deaths, and retirements. Turnover data reflect employees in all work schedules (full-time, part-time, and intermittent) and all tenures (permanent and temporary and indefinite appointments). In the U.S. Postal Service, turnover data include all categories of Postal employment, both career and non-career; non-career types include temporaries, casuals, and replacements for employees on leave. The report presents turnover data for the following categories:

**Transfers** - employees who, without a break in service of one full workday, change from a position in one agency to a position in another agency, including mass transfers of employees between agencies as a result of transfer of functions.

**New Hires** - new appointments of individuals who currently are not Federal civilian employees to positions in the competitive service, excepted service, and Senior Executive Service, including reinstatements based on prior service.

**Restorations, Returns to Duty** - includes employees who exercise reemployment rights following military service and those returning to duty following a reduction in force, from suspension or leave without pay that was scheduled to exceed 30 calendar days, from seasonal furlough, or pending action on reopening appeal.

**Quits** - voluntary resignations by employees or separations by agency if employee declines new assignment (decision not to accept a new job); abandons position (left the job); joins military; or fails to return from military furlough.

As of January 1979 agencies report employment data either as of (1) the last day of the month, or (2) the last day of the pay period closest to the end of the month. However at the end of the fiscal year, agencies report on the last day of the month to meet the Office of Management and Budget's reporting requirements. Payroll and Turnover data are reported as of the beginning and through the end of the report period.
