Implementation of the Fire Management Accident Report for the Safety

Management Information System (SMIS)

This memorandum announces the availability of the new Fire Management Accident Report in Interior's Web-based Safety Management Information System (SMIS). When any employee is injured on-the-job and/or when property is damaged, it is Departmental policy that an Accident Report be promptly filed through SMIS by the supervisor. The new SMIS report was created to capture specific fire management information that will make safety statistics more useful for prevention of future fire-related accidents. It will also improve the accuracy of Interior's overall safety statistics.

The Department of the Interior's Fire Management Program involves a very large number of permanent and seasonal employees. The duties performed by many firefighters regularly expose them to high risk situations. For that reason, safety must always be of highest priority. When an injury and/or property damage occurs during any fire management activity (e.g., training, prescribed fires, fire suppression, fuels reduction, etc.), it is to be reported through SMIS. SMIS can be accessed through www.smis.doi.gov. Effective immediately, any FY 2002 outstanding fire-related accident and/or property damage reports, and any new reports are to be entered by using the new SMIS Fire Management Accident Report. The accident report review process, as designated by each bureau, remains unchanged.

The new SMIS report was developed through the combined efforts with the National Interagency Fire Center and the Office of Managing Risk and Public Safety.
