## Review <u>all</u> squadron medical records

- 1. Compile a list of all aircrew with waivers
- 2. Verify waivers are *properly* documented in NATOPS jackets
- 3. Read the clinic MOU
- 4. Read the squadron 1301/Special Order
- 5. Read the squadron Safety Instruction

6. Meet your AMSO and review Naval Aviation Survival Training Program (NASTP appendix E, OPNAVINST 3710.7T) required annual training in:

- Aeromedical aspects of ejection and emergency ground egress,

- Emergency ground egress — impact, acceleration, survivability and egress,

- Sensory problems — spatial disorientation, visual illusions, visual scanning,

situational awareness and disorientation countermeasures

7. Determine your CO's policy re: privacy & notifications

8. Meet key players: SAFETY-O & ASO, OPSO, NATOPS-O, CMC, MMC, GSPO/GSM, etc.

- 9. Review Pre-Mishap Plans
- 10. Check mishap kits

**11. Read and review your squadron Industrial Hygiene Survey, assist your command in resolving any significant discrepancies**
