2007 U.S. Tourism Quick Facts

Did You Know...?

- » International visitors spent more than \$122 billion on U.S. travel and tourismrelated goods and services in 2007.
- » This represents a 13% increase over the record set in 2006 and a 52% increase over the post-9-11 low set in 2003.
- » Travel and tourism exports accounted for 7% of all U.S. exports and 25% of U.S. services exports.
- » The U.S. travel and tourism balance of trade more than doubled in 2007, increasing 116% to a \$17.6 billion surplus.
- » 2007 marks the 19th consecutive year that U.S. travel and tourism industries have enjoyed a trade surplus.

U.S. Travel and Tourism Exports Reach Historic Heights in 2007

otal international travel receipts (exports) reached unprecedented levels in 2007; indeed, International visitors spent a record-breaking \$122.3 billion on travel to, and tourism-related ac-

tivities within, the United States—an increase of more than 13% over the previous record set in 2006. More so, international visitor spending has increased appreciably (52%) since the post-September 11th low set in 2003 (\$80.3 billion).



year, an increase of 13% over 2006. These goods and services include food, lodging, recreation, gifts, entertainment, local transportation in the United States, and other items incidental to foreign travel.

Passenger fare receipts—fares received by U.S. carriers (and U.S. vessel operators) from international visitors—increased more than 16% over 2006 receipts to \$25.6 billion for the year.

Travel receipts—purchases of travel and tourism-related goods and services by international visitors traveling in the United States—totaled \$96.7 billion for the





International Visitor Spending has Increased 52% Since Post 9–11 Low U.S. Travel and Tourism Exports: 1998 - 2007



Fravel: These accounts cover purchases of goods and services by U.S. persons traveling abroad and by foreign travelers in the United States for business or personal reasons. These goods and services include food, lodging, recreation, gifts, entertainment, local transportation in the country of travel, and other items incidental to a foreign visit. U.S. travel transactions with both Canada and Mexico include border transactions, such as day trips for shopping and sightseeing.

Passenger Fares: These accounts cover the fares received by U.S. air carriers from foreign residents for travel between the United States and foreign countries and between two foreign points, the fares received by U.S. vessel operators for travel on cruise vessels, and the fares paid by U.S. residents to foreign air carriers for travel between the United States and foreign countries and foreign vessel operators for travel on cruise vessels.
